PORTRAIT OF TENNYSON FOR LEVER ART GALLERY
London, April 8.—(By mail).—One of the great portraits of the nineteenth century has just passed from private ownership into a public museum. Lord Leverhulme has purchased Sir John Millais' portrait of Alfred Lord Tennyson for the Lady Lever Art Gallery, Port Sunlight. This impressive portrait was painted in 1881 for Mrs. (later Lady) Tennyson by Sir John Everett Millais, and until his death editor of The Nineteenth Century, an intimate friend of the poet.

The picture is painted on canvas forty-nine inches by thirty-six inches, and is signed with initials and dated 1881.

Plan For Their Summer Training

Fourth Siege Battery to Commence Drill on May 31 in Preparation for Petawawa Shoot.

The 4th Siege Battery met last evening in West St. John with Major E. M. Slater presiding. Plans for the summer training season and the yearly camp were discussed. This battery took first place in the Dominion last year, winning the Governor-General's Cup for general efficiency and the prize for shooting. The first drill will be held on May 31 and the battery will go to Petawawa on June 18.

About thirty-five names have already been placed on the muster roll of those who will go into camp and it is expected that the battery will be recruited up to full strength. The full complement is six officers and forty-eight N. C. O.'s and men. The officers at present are Major E. M. Slater, Captain A. A. Dodge, Lieut. W. M. Simmonds, Lieut. J. G. Hart and Lieut. Thompson. All of the officers will go to camp.

The next meeting of the battery will be held on May 8 for the issue of clothing.

Borrows Theatre to Sing to Old Friend

New York, April 25.—Giuseppe Rosso, once a wine grower in Ottajano, near Naples, sat alone in the Casino Theatre, singing every now and then to shout a lusty "bravo." On the stage, also alone, was Giuseppe Argentino, known in Ottajano fifteen years ago as "Singing Joe" and Rosso had traveled all the way from Italy to hear Argentino sing again.

Back in the grape-growing village in Southern Italy the two Giuseppe were boys together. When Argentino was about fourteen he came to America, where after many difficulties he got

job in a Long Island City laundry. He was a good shirt ironer, but a better singer, and his fame spread. Crowds often blocked the laundry door to hear Argentino sing at his work. A musician heard him once, was impressed and advised him to study.

Argentino took heed, left the laundry, worked hard and finally gave a concert at Town Hall which won him considerable renown. Accounts were copied by Italian newspapers, one of which got into the hands of Rosso among the Ottajano grape vines. Rosso decided then and there to come to America and hear Argentino sing. He sailed on the Arabic about five months ago, but got only as far as Ellis Island. Italy's quota had been filled, so he was sent back. Nevertheless he tried again and landed in Boston last week. When he located Argentino the singer arranged a concert for Rosso at the Casino. He sang "O Paradiso" from L'Africain, "Addio a la Mamma" from Cavalleria Rusticana, "Di Quella Fiera" from Il Trovatore, "La Donna e Mobile" from Rigoletto and Bartlett's "Dreams."

Rosso said he was now content and would sail back to Italy within two weeks.
