

RACY ACCOUNT OF THE TORY CAUCUS

Was Cut and Dried, Says the Toronto Telegram, Which Favors Bob Rogers.

(Toronto Telegram, Conservative) Ottawa, March 7.—(Staff Special.)—The first sad words have been spoken, the first few tears have been shed, and by the time this blossoms into print the "National Liberal and Conservative party" will probably be buried and a new one born into its place. The latter will probably be christened "Liberal-Conservative," but if it got the name it deserves it would grow and flourish as the "Meighen-Caldwell Liberal and Conservative party."

Quebec came through at the last moment. Whether some philanthropist had provided the expenses for the trip deponent saith not. But, headed by Hons. Belley, Monty and Normand, the party of the liberal poured in. They were for Meighen first, last and all the time. They spoke for him and cheered for him. The fact that every caucus or Pierre of them had lost his deposit in the last campaign mattered not a whit. That probably came out anyway. So they came, loaded to the gills with enthusiasm, oratory and advice, and it was all for little Arthur. Had they been a victorious host advancing to take possession of a beaten city they could not have been more cocksure and chatty. That they were treated with more respect and listened to more attentively than the Toronto delegation, who were merely M.P.s, caused little comment. That's as usual. But one of the latter had the bad taste to growl: "Quebec is running the Government, and not satisfied with that, it is trying to run the Opposition as well."

Barren Programme.

But, anyway, the caucus got under way with due enthusiasm. The programme has been carefully prepared and contained little or nothing. As ordinary Tories like Hon. Bob Rogers, J. H. Burnham, of Petersburg, and others of that ilk had been omitted from the invitation list, there was no trouble about Mr. Meighen's endorsement as leader. He has the job boxed up and laid away till the convention meets anyway. And if the members of the old party have their way there won't be any convention for many months to come.

Revising the Name.

Having nothing further to do, the caucus took up such minor details as the name. That ninety per cent. of the delegates were ready to pare down the "National Liberal and Conservative" thing so that it should be more than one syllable is certain. But there were objections. One, Hon. Sidney Meighen would have to explain to his Hamilton constituents.

Sir George Prevalled.

Such Tory stalwarts as Col. J. A. Currie, T. L. Church and Dr. Sheard urged the party to get back where it belongs. But Sir George Foster poured his oily eloquence into the argument, and under the spell of his magic finger, it was finally decided to leave the name to the convention.

About That Convention.

That word "convention" started an old argument. Everybody admitted that a convention should be held, but when? Some eminent Quebec authorities urged that the present muddled era was no time for conventions. Nobody could tell what the morrow might bring forth.

Old Tories frowned and declared darkly that there would be a convention before the end of the year, whether it was called by the present or some other com.

Referred To Committee.

So they referred the matter to a committee. And just to show that there is still no prejudice against Liberal Unionists they gave Hon. Sidney Meighen the chairmanship. That committee met last night, and when it got fairly under way someone propounded the question: "How are you going to call a convention for a party that hasn't got a name?" That started it all over again, and even as this is written the faithful are wrestling with the question of the name. The net result promises to be a shortening of the name to "Liberal-Conservative" and the promise of a convention some time. The "when" is another question. The Meighen board of strategy will put it off as long as possible. It will require careful organization.

Silent Statesmen.

Of that famous board of strategy not much was said at yesterday's gathering. James Calder was there, but adversity has again taught him the value of silence. Not a word did he utter during the afternoon, but he looked, if possible, even wiser than before. Hon. J. A. Stewart was more in evidence, but not much more eloquent, while Senator Sharpe was reported in town, but could not be identified in the crowd.

On the whole it might be said of the great Conservative caucus of 1922 that it was carefully limited and as carefully cut and dried. That it did not run to schedule exactly is probably due to the fact that the board of strategy had a finger in the arrangements.

And when the day's work was done, a frowning Tory M. P. was heard to remark: "Well, the next caucus will be smaller. Only Honest-to-God working M.P.s will be allowed to attend it."

A DECREASE IN THE NET DEBT OF DOMINION

Ottawa, March 9.—A decrease of \$699,882 in the net debt of Canada during the month of February, as compared with an increase of \$3,290,143 in the same month last year, is shown by the financial statement issued from the finance department today. The net debt of Canada now stands at \$2,371,886,102, as compared with \$2,372,585,984 on January 31, 1922, and \$2,397,130,156 on February 28, 1921.

Total revenues collected for the eleven months of the fiscal year which ended on February 28 amounted to \$343,846,708, as compared with \$341,916,180 for a similar period a year ago. This is a decrease in revenue of \$1,930,528. This decrease is offset to a degree by a decrease in total expenditures amounting to \$46,433,543. For the eleven month period of the present fiscal year expenditures totalled \$287,136,970, as compared with \$333,597,513.

The Mennonites are moving into Mexico, the elder said, under the promise of the government that they will in no way be interfered with in their religious, customs and educational system, nor subject to military service.

ANOTHER FALSE ALARM

The second false alarm of this week was rung in last evening, at about 7.30 o'clock, from box 45, situated at the east end of Sheffield street, near the Imperial Oil Company, Limited, premises. Alarms of a blaze in close proximity to the tanks of the oil company aroused uneasiness in the minds of the citizens for a time until the all-out sounded about ten minutes later. This is the second alarm this week to which the department has responded only to draw a blank. In this respect, officials have suggested that citizens should not be too zealous in ringing in alarms, but should investigate promptly. There is a heavy penalty on conviction for improper use of this public safeguard.

CHIEF HEALTH OFFICER SUGGESTS CHANGES IN ACT

Fredericton, March 9.—In the fourth annual report to the minister of health, Dr. George G. Melvin, chief medical officer of the department, urges the necessity for the creation of a fourth health district with headquarters at Campbellton.

Dr. Melvin's report deals with medical inspection of the schools, sanitation, vital statistics, finances, publicity and legislation. He also recommends that the municipal councils be given more complete control over moneys voted by them for health purposes. Appended to Dr. Melvin's report are reports from the district medical health officers: Eastern district, Dr. F. J. Desmond, Newcastle; western district, Dr. J. A. Wade, Fredericton; southern district, Dr. W. Warwick, Dr. H. L. Abramson, chief of the laboratory, also reports, as does the director of nurses, Miss McKeljohn, and director of venereal clinics, Dr. J. A. McCarthy. Tables from the various sub-health districts are printed.

AIM TO EXTEND CANADIAN TRADE

Ottawa, March 9.—In the speech from the throne, read by the governor-general at the opening of parliament this afternoon, the Liberal government announced its programme for the session.

The speech says that Canada has not escaped the world wide industrial depression but expresses the opinion that observers of the business barometer "feel that the worst is about over and that at an early date we may look for a substantial revival of activity."

In this regard, it speaks of the unemployment measures already undertaken by the government.

It announces further that—

1.—Communications have been opened with other countries for an extension of Canadian trade and the widening of Canadian markets.

2.—Confederation has been arranged between the railway authorities with respect to the reduction of rates on basic commodities.

3.—It is intended at an early date to co-ordinate the government owned railway systems with a view to increased efficiency and economy.

4.—An immigration policy will be adopted to attract new settlers.

5.—Parliament will again be consulted regarding re-establishment and medical treatment of returned soldiers.

6.—Negotiations have been opened with the western provinces for transfer of natural resources.

7.—A bill will be introduced creating a department of defence.

8.—The treaties adopted at the Washington conference will be submitted to annual ratification.

9.—Changes will be made in the customs tariff.

The speech further indicates that representatives from Canada will attend the Genoa conference and that Canadian representatives are to be appointed to meet the League of Nations on the question of mail communication.

TRAVEL TALKS ENJOYED.

Travel talks of fascinating interest were given at the meeting of the Fundy Chapter of the I. O. D. E. last night by Mrs. Dalgleish who, with Miss Lois Grimmer, was president of the Young Women's Patriotic Association which has recognized the Fundy Chapter, and by Mrs. E. C. Weyman. The meeting was held in the G. V. W. A. with the regent, Miss Alice Fairweather, presiding.

Two hundred and thirty members present. Mrs. Weyman described a motor trip through England and Scotland. Heartily votes of thanks were extended to the speakers. In the business session the chapter voted \$10 for relief of a needy family and \$5 each to the East St. John and Lancaster hospitals to buy telephone records. Refreshments were served and about fifty members present.

CIGARETTE OUTPUT DROPS.

Five Per Cent. Decrease for January is Noted.

The report on January, 1922, production of tobacco shows a five per cent. decrease in cigarette production, as compared with January of 1921, and an eight per cent. decrease as against the records of 1920. Cigar production showed reductions of four per cent. and thirty-three per cent., respectively, while the production of smoking and chewing tobacco was twenty-four per cent. above last year, but seven per cent. below 1920. The production of snuff showed an increase of thirty-seven per cent., as compared with January, 1921, and a decrease of four per cent. as against 1920.
