HAMBURG FINDS \$1,500,000

Flow of Gas Discovered in 1910 Belongs  
to the City

Hamburg, July 31—By a decision of  
the senate a flow of gas which was dis-  
covered here in November, 1910, rep-  
resents a value of \$1,500,000 to the city.  
A company which was boring for wa-  
ter tapped gas and claimed 5 per cent.  
as the finders' reward. This led to a law-  
suit by the company against the city.  
The company was non-suited in two  
courts on the ground that gas is not  
treasure trove.

A final decision against the company  
was handed down by the Supreme Court  
at Leipzig.

A FISH ELEVATOR

(St. Andrews Beacon)  
A device designed to assist salmon  
to climb over dams and other obstruc-  
tions to reach their spawning grounds is  
being worked out by Prof. Prince and  
Knight at the biology station. It is in  
the nature of an automatic elevator. The  
eager fish enter the cage at the base of  
the obstruction; then the counterpoise,  
which has been gradually filling with  
water drops when the water therein  
reaches a sufficient height, thus raising  
the first laden cage. Upon reaching a  
sluice above the fish are released, and  
the water in the counterpoise is per-  
mitted to escape and the cage again drops  
into position. The device when perfected,  
may be given a test at St. George.
