

Paris, Feb. 27—The amazing story of how a man was beaten and robbed by his daughter and granddaughter is reported from Lorient.

Captain Reculmux, a retired skipper, aged eighty-three, who is living in comfort amidst rare objects gathered by him in all parts of the world during sixty years at sea, received this morning a visit from his daughter, Madame Blanchet, aged sixty; his son-in-law, aged sixty-seven, and his granddaughter, aged twenty-seven. The three intruders ordered him to turn over all his money. When the captain refused, he was knocked to the floor by his son-in-law and then tied to a bed by his daughter. When he called for help he was gagged by his granddaughter. Under the torture of the three, he surrendered 70,000 francs—all the money he had in the house. The progeny declared the sum not sufficient and rebound the aged man. They then ransacked the house of all objects of value, broke the furniture and fied.





POEM IDENTIFIES SOLDIER.

He Had Previously Lain Unknown in a French Grave.

A typewritten poem, found on the body of an American soldier killed near Binarville, France, proved recently the means of identifying the body as that of Thomas O'Keefe, Company D, 306th Machine Gun Battalion, Seventh Division. By tracing the poem to its author and checking over the lists of the Twenty-seventh Divisions, searchers ultimately found the widow of the missing soldier, who positively identified other articles found on the body.

Records of the Graves Registration Service show that when the body was taken from its battlefield resting place it was believed to be that of Corporal Logan Wheeler, Company D, 364th Infantry, known to have been killed near the spot.

Inquiries showed no record of any men named Wheeler or O'Keefe employed by the copper company or the newspaper and known to have been in France. The poem, however, bore the name of the author, Charles Scott, and he was located in New York City. He had written it, he said, while with the New York National Guard on the Mexican border, in 1916, but he did not know how a copy might have reached France.
