HORSE AND CAR SUFFER IN CRASH

In City road near the eastern end of Haymarket square, at 2.40 o'clock Saturday afternoon a horse, driven by John Forsyth, 39 Marsh street and owned by C. H. Peters Sons, Ltd., was in collision with automobile No. 7,338, owned by Henry Appleby, 242 Paradise row. The horse received a dislocated shoulder and some cuts, and the harness was broken, while the automobile received a broken radiator, bumper and hood. The car also ran into a fire hydrant and became fastened there when the bumper caught on the hydrant.

DIVORCE CONTRASTS.

Comparison of recently issued statistics on marriage and divorce by the Governments of the United States and Canada shows that the tradition of the married state "till death do us part" is observed more literally in the Dominion than with us, says the New York Times. In all of Canada during the last year there were but seven divorces in units of 100,000 population, a total of 544 in all of the provinces, or only two-thirds of 1 per cent. of the whole number of marriages contracted during the same period. This number is said by statisticians to be large for Canada and due to the fact that after the war, when there were many hasty, ill-advised marriages, divorces increased.

Of the total number of divorces in 1923 in Canada, husbands received 60 per cent. and wives 40 per cent. British Columbia led in the number of decrees with 188, followed by Alberta with 129 and Manitoba with 97. One province, Prince Edward Island, has granted but one divorce since 1868, and that was in 1912.

On the other hand, while divorce has never reached alarming proportions in Canada and is actually decreasing, the situation is quite the reverse in the United States. While in 1916 in each unit of 100,000 population there were 1,055 marriages and 112 divorces, in 1923 in each 100,000 there were 1,083 marriages and 138 legal separations. The number of divorces for each divorce was 7.6 for all the States in the latter year.

The darkest side of the record shows more divorces than marriages in Nevada, where during the year the church joined 835 couples and the law separated 1,006. Of course, it should be noted in this connection that many men and women from other states secure Reno divorces in large numbers, owing to the favorable laws of Nevada. Oregon has a record of but 2.6 marriages to a divorce; Wyoming, 3.9 to 1; Montana, 4.3 to 1.

Contrary to the belief that there is the greatest insecurity in the married state in thickly settled communities, in New York State in 1923 there were 95,727 marriages and 4,328 divorces, or 22.6 unions for each legal separation, a record exceeded only in the district of Columbia, also densely populated, where the proportion was 35.8 to 1.

FABLES ON HEALTH Swat the Fly

With the arrival of summer days, Anytown began to organize its annual fly swatting campaign—largely because flies became bothersome, but with little thought for the fundamental reason for such drives.

The part played by flies as disease carriers is emphasized each season. Flies carry germs from the streets, from sick rooms, from garbage and cellars and swamps, and almost everywhere. They can carry these germs directly to a baby's lips, to the food or milk, or water.

Typoid and other epidemics have been almost directly traced to flies. Thus also mosquitoes, it is little known that mosquitoes have provided in their bodies a place for malaria germs to grow—that the mosquito does not mechanically carry malaria, but breeds the fever germs in its body.
