Without any warning the building was surrounded by the guard regiment and a detachment of cavalry, and a hundred pelicemen marched into the hall where Count Heyden, a marshal of the nobility and a member of parliament for St. Petersburg, was presiding and ordered the meeting to disperse under instructions from the chief of police. Vigorous protests were made that the meeting was entirely legal, but the police were inexorable, and the members of parliament left the hall after drawing up a formal protest which was signed by 28 of the members. M. Roditcheff, a member of parliament for St. Petersburg, hurried after midnight to the hall where the constitutional democrats were holding their convention and announced to the members there assembled the action taken by the police. Seek Safety in Flight.

Odessa, May 8 .- Although the emigration of Jews to South Russia decreased during the last two months, it daily from Odessa alone, and the exodus from the less populous Jewish cenlation. 
