Christmas Day. The ADVANCE will reach a good many of its readers on Christmas Day, and we, therefore, beg to wish them the compliments of the season, and hope that this year's recurrence of the great festival brings not only to them, but to the whole community an even fuller measure of happiness than ever before.

Lesson in Monopoly. The evil of government giving exclusive rights of public franchises to private companies is illustrated by the experience of Mr. Marconi of wireless telegraphy fame, in Newfoundland.

The civilized world's attention was turned, last week, to the announcement of the great scientist that he had succeeded in having telegraphic signals transmitted, without wires, from Cornwall, in England, to a point near St. John's, Newfoundland—a distance of 1700 miles.

It happened, however, that the Anglo-American Company had, in 1854, secured from the Newfoundland government the exclusive right to land and erect telegraphic cables and plant and to conduct telegraphic business in every part of that island for fifty years.

As soon, therefore, as the company learned that Marconi had succeeded in establishing the fact that trans-Atlantic telegraphing could be done without the medium of the ocean cable, they practically ordered him off the island.

This called forth vigorous protests from all quarters, for it was too much, in the world's view, that a monopoly should attempt to block a scientific development by which great commercial and social benefits were to be conferred. Then, the monopoly realized its mistake. Its second move was to notify Mr. Marconi to this effect: "While we will take the necessary legal steps to secure our rights, we will give you our careful consideration to any proposals which may be put forward by you with a view to the further continuance of your work."

This meant that Mr. Marconi would not be permitted to follow up the development of his discovery in Newfoundland, unless he paid the Anglo-American monopoly for the privilege of doing so, or allowed his discovery to be swallowed up by the Anglo-American monopoly.

Such is the result of Newfoundland's attacks on the monopoly of the Anglo-American company. The man who secured the telegraphic monopoly at that time has made millions out of it, and they would, no doubt, have blocked the advent of the millennium rather than forego the privilege of continuing to enrich themselves.

There is another telegraphic monopoly on Prince Edward Island. It is this Anglo-American company that has created and maintained it. It charges exorbitant rates for messages, and closes its offices early every evening, shutting the people out from communication with the rest of the world every night. Neither the newspapers, nor private individuals can get dispatches for about one half of every twenty-four hours. Efforts have been made by Boards of Trade and through other channels to secure its prevention, but the monopolists are deaf to them and practically defy public requirements under modern laws.

The Halifax Railway. Expressions of opinion on the proposal of the Halifax Board of Trade to hand the management of the Intercolonial Railway over to the Canadian Pacific Railway Company have been made by several interested public bodies, and it is reassuring to find that there is practically but one view of the subject, and that is opposition to the suicidal suggestion.

We were interested to know whether the gentlemen of the Halifax Board of Trade had any valid reasoning with which to support their proposal, and have been afforded some information on the subject in a report in the Transcript of a meeting of the Moncton Board of Trade which took place on Wednesday evening of last week.

There were present at that meeting, Messrs. G. S. Campbell, W. A. Black and J. A. Chipman of the Halifax board, Mr. Campbell, according to the report, was there as president of that board, Mr. Chipman, as the author of the Halifax Board's resolution, and Mr. Black, as president of the Maritime Board of Trade. It goes without saying that Mr. Black had no authority to speak on the subject for the Maritime board in support of the Halifax board's position, but as the report of his remarks does not indicate that he advanced any argument or reason why the Halifax view of the matter should be adopted, it may be said that he did neither harm nor good on either side. He seemed to go no further than to say, in effect, that as Halifax did not get as much traffic as it was thought by Halifax that Halifax ought to have through the Grand Trunk, C. P. R., and

I. C. R. there ought to be some change made. His speech was quite unconvincing on any practical suggestion of a specific character. It seemed to be on the usual Halifax line, which is that while doing nothing itself by which its magnificent harbor and geographical position might be taken advantage of for the development of its trans-Atlantic traffic, Halifax expects the government, or some other outside agency to step in and do something; for which, however, it fails even to present a workable scheme. Perhaps some other Halifax man may exist who would have succeeded in giving some excuse for the position in which Halifax placed itself in its advocacy of the C. P. R. scheme, but, if so, he was not sent to Moncton—because, it may be, that he was president of the Maritime board.

Mr. Chipman seemed to think there ought to be two trunk railways running into Halifax, and that such conditions would bring winter port business to and through that city, but he did not advance any reason for entertaining that view.

Moncton and other speakers showed that no advantage to the country generally, or to Halifax in particular could be expected from a curtailment, in any respect, of government control of the Intercolonial, and they very properly took the ground that private control must lead in the direction of monopoly which would create arbitrary freight rates for internal traffic.

A healthy sentiment seems, therefore, to pervade the country in reference to this important question. It is realized that both the Canadian Pacific and Intercolonial are doing a great work in the commercial development of the country, but the true interests of the people lie in offering a sturdy resistance to any attempt that may be made to eliminate government control from the railway business of the Maritime provinces. The Intercolonial management has saved the business men of these provinces from local freight exactions which have been a general cause of complaint wherever private railway monopoly has existed, and even if Halifax could secure a little greater share of winter port trade than it has by a transfer of the I. C. R. to C. P. R. control, the advantage it would thereby gain would be much more than offset by the losses which would result to the general trade of the country by means of the higher rates which local traffic would be required to pay.

Halifax, however, cannot reasonably expect to become a competitor of St. John as the Canadian winter port; and the C. P. R., in endeavoring to make gentlemen of its board of trade believe that the volume of trans-Atlantic traffic now going to that port over the I. C. R. would be materially increased were that road handed over to it, are working for the extension of the trust and monopoly system, which is becoming the bane of the industrial as well as of the commercial world, if not severely resisted. The people, to whom governments are responsible, can influence them against oppression—whether it be political or commercial, if the interests involved are under government control—but once power is handed over to private monopoly the only limits to its exactions is the ability of those with whom it deals to pay tribute. Government control is, therefore, safest for the people.

His Verbal Tactics. Senator Ellis, editor of the St. John Globe, has, considering his position in the public life of the country, assumed an attitude towards the Premier of New Brunswick which he can hardly defend, by permitting him to be cruelly and scurrilously attacked through the columns of his paper by anonymous correspondents. What would Senator Ellis think if any other editor professing to conduct a respectable newspaper, presenting its columns to the public in that way against him? Senator Ellis, however has always had two sides to his character. His language, as a rule, is kept the best towards the public.

Queens County Coal Mines. Mr. Fred M. Tweedie sent to Danville about two months ago to look into the working of the Butler excavator for the purpose of giving the New Brunswick Coal and Railway Company information as to its practicability as a means of raising coal in large quantities on the Queens county area in New Brunswick. His report which was published in some of the leading papers of the province at the time, favored the principle of the Butler plant, but advised that the company await the construction and working of a new and improved one before investing. Subsequent inquiries made for the company by mechanical engineer Fleming confirm Mr. Tweedie's opinion of the Butler excavator, and they have decided to enter into negotiations with the patentees with the view of securing one of these machines, which will be capable of raising from 500 to 700 tons of coal per day.

Under the auspices of the South Pacific Coal Society, Mr. C. A. Duff-Miller, Agent General for New Brunswick, delivered a lecture in the Institute on Sunday afternoon on "St. John," being one of a series on "Our Ours and Municipalities."

Mr. Miller spoke for about an hour to a much increased audience. At the close he dealt with New Brunswick's geographical position, and referred to the early history of the Province, formerly included in the old Province of Nova Scotia, the

favorable position of St. John as an ocean port, and its railway connections with Western Canada by means of the C. P. R. and I. C. R. were pointed out on a map. The lecturer supplied a great amount of information regarding the resources and capabilities of the Province, while the lantern slides brought his audience within sight, as might be said, of the great lumber camps, of the removal of cut trees to the sea, and of the process of sawing, &c. These factories at work were also shown, and the progress of manufacture traced from the arrival of mill cut lumber to the time when it is shipped to the market in Canada, the United States and England. In addition there were views of orchards in full bloom; of fanning operations in various parts of the Province; of scenery on the St. John and Miramichi rivers, including "camping out in summer;" of Indian life, and of vessels illustrating the progress of shipbuilding. Mr. Miller's references in the course of his lecture, to the settlement of the United Empire Loyalists, called forth hearty applause. The site of Fredericton, as it appeared in the early years of the last century was contrasted with the Fredericton of today, the capital of the Province, while views of some of the prominent buildings of St. John made New Brunswickers are wanting in nothing which goes to make a modern appearance generally.

What Storms do to the Railways. People who grumble over delayed railway trains and are inconvenienced and out of pocket because their correspondents are not forwarded or their freight required sometimes have little idea of what the railways have to contend with. Here is a condensed telegraphic report of the condition of things on the Canadian Pacific and Intercolonial railways, as they appeared on the day after the storm of 13th inst. West of Ashville is a washout 15 feet long. Between Moncton and Greenville is another. A mile west of Elliot's a washout extends for 7 feet.

Between Elliot and Ounas there is a washout of 100 feet long and 12 feet deep. One mile west of Brownville there is a washout of 100 feet long and 12 feet deep where the track was washed away. A mile west of Elliot's another deep subsection.

Practically all the cuts between Moncton and Brownville are filled with mud and water.

Superior observers say that the line has been cleared between Elliot and Brownville, but that 27 miles of track is still blocked. The main trunk is blocked between Bangor and Waterville, and it is very probable that no communication can be made with the Bangor and Arsenic lines.

The Quebec Valley Railroad Quaker Brook has a washout 30 feet long and 15 feet deep. At Pink Bluff a washout of 120 feet long and 15 feet deep. These occurred on Sunday and the train of the Montreal and St. Lawrence Atlantic Express, which was delayed at Magog, returned to Quebec on Monday morning.

The train has a number of passengers for Montreal, and it is likely that it will probably arrive at Halifax early in the morning.

At 10:30 last night there arrived from Bangor a made up train with a light freight, a few passengers and some mail matter. The train was unable to get any connection west of Bangor. They think that the water on the West of Ashville washout will freeze under the influence of the present cold wave. This will necessitate a further delay of the train, and men an extended period of tedious and difficult work.
