LIST GROWING SMALL.

The list of "square riggers" hailing from Boston is rapidly growing smaller, three bark-rigged vessels having been reported lost within a few weeks.

CARGO VALUATION.

The C.P.R. line steamer Lake Michigan, for London and Antwerp, took away Canadian goods valued at \$262,344, and foreign goods valued at \$89,884, making a total valuation of \$352,228.

FIRST OUTWARD STEAMER FROM QUEBEC PORT.

Quebec, Mar. 31.—Steamer Natsahquinn leaves today for Seven Islands, Anticosti, and other Gulf ports, with passengers, mails and general cargo.

SOLD AT LAST.

After being hauled up at Boston for nearly five years, the three-masted schooner Collin C. Baker has been sold to Capt. George H. Crockett of Portland, formerly master of the schooner Mattie J. Allen, who will employ her in the coasting trade.

BUILDING NEW TUG BOAT.

The Mutual Company has contracted with the Robert Palmer Shipbuilding Co., of New Brunswick, for building a tugboat of the following dimensions: Length, 110 feet; beam, 23 feet 6 inches; depth, 10 feet 6 inches; compound engines, 162224.

BOUND FOR HALIFAX.

Steamer Scotian is due at Halifax with several hundred passengers. The steamer Campanello left Rotterdam for Halifax on Tuesday with 630 steerage passengers, 154 of whom are for the United States.

THE LOCKWOOD'S CONDITION.

Rockport, Mass., March 30.—Schr Ann Louisa Lockwood, from St. John, N. B., for New York, before reported ashore on Sandy Point breakwater, is to be towed to destination; a diver reported her forefoot badly twisted and a number of butts open; the leaky butts and seams will be covered with canvas and one steam pump will keep the water out while she is being towed to New York.

SCHOONERS AND BARK WRECKED.

Mobile, Ala., March 29.—Schooner Laura L. Sprague, which went ashore on Sand Island Sunday, is being stripped. Sandy Hook, March 29.—Bark Ant, previously reported ashore on Squan Beach, is being stripped; vessel will go to pieces.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

Tampa, Fla., March 27.—Stmr Algiers, Hansen, from Philadelphia, reported March 22, 10 a. m., passed black and white perpendicular striped can buoy in lat 31, lon 82 22, in 13 1/2 fathoms. Stmr Lochwood (Br) reports March 17, lat 22 N, lon 65 20 W, passed a black bell buoy with bell gone.

SCHOONER TOTAL LOSS.

Lubec, Me., March 27.—Schr Gen. Scott, from Calais for Boston, during a heavy easterly gale today parted her anchor chain in West Quoddy Bay and was driven onto Crowell Ledge; vessel and cargo will be a total loss; the crew were rescued by life savers.

LOST A BARGE.

Boston, March 29.—Stmr William Chisholm, from New Port News for Portland, arrived off Newport today and sent word ashore by a tug, that she parted from barge Lancaster, from Newport News for Boston, south of Shinnecock yesterday afternoon; in attempting to recover the barge the steamer's after house was stove in and her engine room gutted; a revenue cutter will probably be despatched to search for the Lancaster. (A barge under sail, supposed to be the Lancaster, was reported 15 miles south of Block Island at 4 p. m., 28th.)
