When the Gallant Canadians charged the enemy's lines on many a hard fought field their verve and dash carried them right through the enemy's positions and into conflict with the reserve troops behind. It then became the duty of supporting battalions to "clean up" the ground covered, bombing the dugouts in which terrified Germans had taken cover, rushing pill boxes and bringing prisoners in by the score. This was the task of the 26th New Brunswick Battalion at Courcelette and stiff work it was—But it was well and thoroughly done.

The Canadian army as a whole did far more than could reasonably be expected of it during the war—never failing to achieve its objective, never yielding ground once captured and consolidated—Our four divisions really met and defeated one-fourth of the whole German army during 1918.

Our soldiers have won the day, they have carried the charge. It remains for the people at home to "Mop Up" after the long battle which ended so gloriously one year ago tomorrow.
