CONTINUED.

GENERAL PRICE IMPROVEMENT

Market Determined to Go up Yesterday in Spite of Everything.

New York, June 18.—The general improvement in prices, which began before noon, continued through the afternoon and traders remarked that the market wanted to go up in spite of money, politics and commercial conditions. Crucible sold six points above its close and some of the other stocks advanced a point or more. The Montreal Oil stocks recovered 2 to 5 points and even the metals joined the rise to a limited extent.

Some of the bulls made good gains like 8 points in Reading and five in D. L. and W. usually an inactive stock. The declaration of the regular dividend on North Pacific made the short interest in the rails created by the reduction of the Chicago and North-Western dividend uneasy. The market paid no attention to the American Federation of Labor's demand for government ownership which the Street looks upon as largely a matter of fact. Call money advanced to 5 per cent in the last hour closing at 8 per cent but did not seriously check the rise in stocks which was of course largely a covering movement.
