

in their work but for a few months, and it is our pleasing duty to state, that in their public ministrations, as well as in their efforts to awaken the careless, and comfort the sick and dying from house to house, their first labours have been abundantly appreciated and blessed.

As these Gentlemen are present your Committee deem it unnecessary to say more, but would leave it for themselves to enlist your sympathies, by the recital of the trials and privations to which the Missionary is exposed, the destitution which he must witness, and the hopeful results which the Society may be encouraged to look for, from this "work of faith and labour of love."

And still another cause for thanksgiving may be found in the steady progress which the Church is making, and the growing attachment of her children to this their cherished Institution. Notwithstanding the privations to which our people have been exposed during the past year—a year unprecedented for hardships of various kinds, yet from almost every Parish throughout the Province, the contributions of the faithful have been sent forward; and those who enjoyed the ministrations of the Gospel have not forgotten their less favoured brethren, but have laid up in store for them as God in his goodness has enabled them.

INCOME.

The following are the Remittances from the Parochial Associations for the past year:—

ANNAPOLIS.—£23.

AYLESFORD.—£22 15, shewing a steady increase of the funds of this Branch of our Society year after year. This includes One Pound from Mr. Wm. Tupper, in aid of Missions to the Heathen.

BRIDGETOWN.—£22. We are glad to find that the zeal in the Society's cause in this Branch is so manifest, the amount remitted this year being nearly double that of last year.

From CHESTER.—Has been remitted the sum of £17 17 9.—This is a larger sum than that subscribed last year, which Dr. Shreve desires the Committee to regard as an evidence of the growing attachment of his people to the good cause.

From CORNWALLIS and HORTON.—£11 1 10½; an increase above that of last year, indicative of the healthy tone of Church feeling in that mission also.
