HOME RULE IN THE HOUSE OF COMMONS. LONDON, July 3. the discussion of Dr. Butt's home-rule

motion was resumed. The O'Doneghue, member for Tralee said the home-rule movement was a miserable compromise concocted by those who did not dare to face the penal ies of Fenianism. He acknowledged the desire of Eugland to conciliate Ireland, and said that preserverance in this agitation would be in defiance of gratitude, justice and common sense. He said that the ultimate object of the leaders of the movement was to incite Irishmen to force the repeal of the Union, and their success would plunge Ireland in civil war and annul the recent progress in that country. He said further that if England continued to remove every pretext for the plea of misgovernment in Ireland, the result would be the disgraceful failure of the movement. He firmly believed its success would bring ruin to the interests of every man in Ireland.


