UTAH—1875.

The M. W. Grand Lodge of Utah commenced its Fourth Annual Communication at Masonic Hall, Salt Lake City, on Tuesday, 9th November, A. L. 5875. M. W. Charles W. Bennett, presiding.

Six Lodges represented.

The G. M. refers pathetically to the loss sustained by the Craft in the death of M. W. W. Mercer Wilson, G. M. of Canada, and claims for his widow, now residing in the jurisdiction of the G. L. of Utah, such sympathy as should be found welling up in every Masonic heart, which has freely imbibed the lessons taught in the work in which her late husband sustained such a prominent and noble part.
