of any person convicted of any of the offences above mentioned, for levying the penalty and the costs, and in default of payment within fifteen days after the condemnation, a warrant or order may issue against the body of the person convicted of such offence, to imprison such person in the Common Gaol, within the limits of the Jurisdiction of the Court or Justice before whom he shall have been convicted, until the penalty and the costs shall be paid. 5

VII. Provided always, and be it enacted, That a Tavern-keeper or Hotel-keeper duly licensed, shall not be considered as selling intoxicating liquor by the glass within the prohibition of this Act, or as selling the same in contravention of this Act, by reason of his selling wine to any traveller or to any person lodging and boarding in his house, provided such wine is sold and drunk at the ordinary meals of such traveller or boarder. 10

VIII. And be it enacted, That all Courts, Judges and Justices of the Peace, shall construe this Act so as to prevent evasions and subterfuges and so as to cover the act of giving as well as of selling intoxicating liquor, in the places and manner above prohibited. 15
