

## An Act respecting the Safety of Ships.

**I**N amendment of the law respecting the safety of ships, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as *The Safety of Ships Amendment Act*, 1900. Short title.

**2.** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in section 7 of *The Act respecting the safety of ships and the prevention of accidents on board thereof*, chapter 77 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 3 of chapter 44 of the statutes of 1894, steamships sailing from any port or place in Canada between the sixteenth day of March and the twelfth day of October in each year, to any port or place out of Canada, shall not be subject to any of the restrictions therein provided as to deck loads, and no master of any steamship so sailing shall be liable for any of the penalties therein prescribed.
