## GEORGII III. REGIS.

## CAP. LV.

An Act to prevent Foreign Goods of certain Descriptions being brought from the United States of America into Canada; and to allow a greater Quantity of Worsted Yarn to be exported from Great Britain to Canada. [5th May 1812.]

THEREAS it is expedient that Foreign Goods and Commodities not of the Growth of the Territories of the United States of America, should not be brought from the said Territories by Inland Navigation or Land Carriage into the Province of Upper and Lower Canada, to the Prejudice of the Trade carried on by Sea from the United Kingdom to the faid Provinces; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament affembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That no Goods or No Goods Commodities whatfoever, except Goods and Commodities of the Growth, (except of Produce, or Manufacture of the Territories of the United States of America, American shall be brought from the Territories of the said United States of America be brought by Inland Navigation or Land Carriage, into the Provinces of Lower or from the Upper Canada, under the Penalty of the Forfeiture of the faid Goods or United States Commodities, or the Value thereof, together with the Vessel or Car. into Canada riage in which the same shall be brought; to be sued for, recovered, and for Forfeiture. distributed in the like Manner as is directed in any Act in the Case of Offences being committed against the Laws of Customs in any of His Majesty's Plantations in Africa or America.
