Barberie will make you a present to your Sates faction of you Except the protection and frindship of the English you resolve to Do nothing that may most Justly provoke us & perticularly not premit any of the french Indians to pass through your Pountry in order to make war upon the English Colonies which They do in order to Deftroy you by Weakening your Brethren and best frinds but above all let let me never hear again that any of you have to much for lost your Under standing as to afsist the french Indians in Juck Experition & So prepare I halt have occasion to reprove you in this manner & y you will take fare that while you are here & in your return home you do not Meddle with any thing that belongs to the Inhibitants, I have Complaints of michief Some by Some of you were Comeing hither I Export that you will do nothing of that hino for the ficture y on that Condition I pass over what has been done already and upon the whole.
