Anglo-Soviet relations - my preceding telegram of to-day. With regard to the statement already telegraphed, it is intended that it should be immediately followed by a further statement showing that evidence. is available to prove every basis on which not only the Soviet Trade Delegation and also the Soviet Legation could be permitted to remain in this country has been violated, and that H.M. Government in Great Britain is left no choice but to terminate the Trade Agreement of 1921 and to sever diplomatic relations with the Government of the Soviet Union, in view of the cumulative effect of the evidence in possession of His Majesty's Government. This further statement, the form of which is now under consideration, will be communicated to you in a separate telegram as soon as possible.
