Sir.-

Referring to your letter of the 18th inst., enclosing three tenders and specifications for repairs required to the Delaware bridge over Boston Creek, Concession 3, Oneida, I beg to state that the figures in Mr. Robert Martin's tender which are badly made might be read \$45, as well as \$75. It should be ascertained which sum Mr. Martin intended to mention. It is impossible to judge from the nature of the work and from the specifications which sum would be a fair one for the work.

The specifications are approved, and as Mr. Martin's tender is the lowest in any case, it may be accepted, and the work proceeded with as soon as you have ascertained, as above stated, which amount is the correct one.
