Sir,-

It has been represented to this Department by the Chief Commissioner of the Dominion Police that there is an Indian named Claus on the Six Nations reserve from whom they are desirous of obtaining information as to an Indian by the name of John English, who is now serving a term in the Kingston Penitentiary for arson, and who is desirous of getting out on parole. It has been stated that you would endeavour to bring Claus to Chief Constable Sleiman's office in Brantford if you had an order from the Department to that effect. I have to request that you will endeavour to see Claus and have him taken before Chief Constable Sleiman.
