## SWORN STATEMENT BY THE ACCUSED (Continued)

- Q. Had you travelled far that day?
- A. It was quite a long distance. About 200 miles. The speed-ometer on my truck doesn't work.

## QUESTIONED BY THE PROSECUTING OFFR

- Q. You admit that you went to EECLOO with Gnr. Jones and you asked him to get the water while you went on a little expedition of your own. Is that normal procedure?
- A. I never had anything said to me in the HQ about not letting anyone to drive my truck.
- Q. Is it the normal procedure to start off on a trip and let someone else finish it?
- A. This was the first time I have done it.
- Q. Did you think it within your rights?
- A. I thought it a good chance to do some shopping.
- Q. You say you went into the cafe and had a few drinks. How many?
- A. Two beers, and 3 shots of licquer.
- Q. How long was it that you stood in front of the cafe waiting for Jones?
- A. Five or ten minutes. At about 20 minutes to eight.
- Q. Then you went back into the cafe?
- A. For about 2 mimutes.
- Q. You didn't have any more to drink?
- A. No sir.
- Q. What time was it when you were picked up by the "175" half track?
- A. About 5 or 10 after 8.
- Q. Do you know what time it was when you arrived back?
- A. I thought I was in plenty of time to take my shift on guard.
- Q. Were you on the morning parade at 0900 hrs?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Did you hear Sgt. Walker instruct you that you would be on guard duty that night?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Did he name a specific time to report?
- A. Yes sir.
- Q. Did you report?
- A. I met L/Bdr. Chapman before I went for water and I told him I was going for water and to let the other two chaps toss up for first and last shifts and I would take the middle one.
