

filled with grout up to the plates all around the building leaving room inside one inch, for for the furring to come out even with the joist for lathing

Four windows, twelve lights 10 x 12 glass, one door doubled with one inch lumber, three feet wide and seven feet high, to be hung with heavy strap hinges, with latches and lock complete. door to open outside.

The floor to be ~~or~~ 1 1/4 inch groove and tongue lumber, a platform to be made all across the building one foot high and seven feet wide. Wainscot all around the building as high as the window sills inside, with one inch lumber. The chimney to be built of brick framed in the wall below the ceiling in order to make the stove pipe hole below the ceiling, lathed and plastered inside and finished off with two coats of plastering

The teachers desk as may be decided - The timber for the frame 6 x 6 inches to be good and sound.

The ceiling to be arched by means of collar beams, and 1/2 inch iron rod put through the plates to support the Roof.

The whole work to be finished up in a good workmanlike manner
