

THE SUBJUNCTIVE.

150. **The subjunctive mood** is used after verbs or adjectives together with verb *être*, expressing feelings or operations of the mind, and impersonal verbs, other than those of certainty.

Il faut que vous *veniez* faner.

Vous *voulez* que je *parte* !

Elle est *fâchée* que je me *sois* attardé.

151. The present subjunctive may always be used in a subordinate clause depending on a principal clause in which the verb is in the present conditional :

Il faudrait qu' il *vienn*e ou *vint*.

152. In sentences dependent on a conjunction requiring the subjunctive mood, the general rule may be followed :

INDICATIVE		SUBJUNCTIVE
Present	requires	Present
Future	"	Present
Imperfect	"	Imperfect or Past
Conditional present	"	Imperfect or Present
Past tense	"	Perfect
Past indefinite	"	Perfect
Future anterior or past	"	Present Perfect
Past perfect	"	Past Perfect
Conditional past	"	Past Perfect.

Il faut que vous *lisiez*.

*Il faudr*a que vous *lisiez*.

*Il fall*ait que vous *lussiez*.

*Il faudr*ait que vous *lussiez* or *lisiez*.

*Il fall*ut que vous *ayez lu*.

*Il a fall*u que vous *ayez lu*.

*Il aura fall*u que vous *ayez lu*.

*Il av*ait *fall*u que vous *eussiez lu*.

*Il aur*ait *fall*u que vous *eussiez lu*.

153. The subjunctive and sometimes the indicative is required after the following conjunctions.

de manière que	(= so that)
En or de sorte que	(= in such a manner that)
si ce n' est que	(= were it not that)
sinon que	(= except that)
tellement que	(= so much that).
