well as my felfe, First therefore it is not to bee forgotten, that Sebaffian Gabot wrote to mafter Baptilla Ramufius, that he veryly beleeued that all the North part of America's divided into Is landes. Secondly that mafter John Verarzanus, which had been thrife on that coaft, in an olde excellent mappe, which he gaue to king Henrie the eight, and is yet in the cullodie of mafter Locke, doth folay it out, as it is to bee feene in the mappe annexed to the end of this boke, beeing made according to Verarzanus plar, Thirdly the flory of Gil Gonfalua recorded by Francifcus Los pesde Gomara, which is faide to have fought a pallage by the Northweft, feemeth to argue and proue the fame .
