THE PRIVY COUNCIL.

This office is not administrative, as are the various other departments. It applies the rules and ordinances which are put into effect by the several departments.

It was created by the British North America Act, and all estimates, public bills, etc., are considered in Council before being submitted to Parliament, and all matters which are not purely departmental are first presented to this Council.

DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE.

Known as the Crown Law Department until organized, May, 1868.

The Minister of Justice is ex-officio Attorney-General of Canada, the legal adviser of his Excellency the Governor-General, and legal adviser of the Privy Council.

He superintends all matters in Canada in connection with the administration of justice which are outside the Provincial autonomy. He is entrusted with the conduct of all litigation in which Canada is involved, and also has the settlement and approval of all instruments under the Great Seal of Canada.

The Minister of Justice has also the administration of the penitentiaries of the Dominion. This office was occupied by the late Sir John Thompson until his death, December 12, 1894.
