Address of the Assembly.

"To His Excellency T H O M A S C A R L E T O N, Ef-"quire, Lieutenant Governor and Commander in Chief of the "Province of New-Brunswick, &c. &c.

" The humble Address of the House of Assembly.

May it please Your Excellency!

"HE HOUSE of ASSEMBLY will take into im"mediate confideration the business left unfinished at
"the close of the last Session, and also such papers as Your Ex"CELLENCY may be pleased to order to be laid before them,
"and will, with all possible dispatch, endeavour to make pro"vision for paying off the debts of the province.

"This House does not contemplate the establishment of permanent Salaries, but will, as heretofore, with every promptitude do their utmost to make suitable provision for payment of those employed in the public service; which they earnestly strove to accomplish during the last Session; and they most feelingly lament that any thing has occurred to retard the accomplishment of that most desirable object, or to have brought this province into such a situation as will put it out of their power speedily to retrieve it's public credit and prosperity.

"Being conscious of having ever, to the utmost abilities of the province, provided for the persons employed in the public service, the House observe with extreme distress the pointed charge, addressed particularly to them by Your Excellency, of having exposed those persons to such delay in payment as, in a great measure, amounts to a denial of justice.

"Actuated by that Loyalty to His Majesty and zeal for the public welfare, which has always diffinguished the proceedings of the House of Assembly of New-Brunswick, and by which alone they can obtain the approbation of their constituents, this House will anxiously cultivate a spirit of harmony; and in all their deliberations keep in view and be folely guided by the British constitution, which clearly points out the unalienable rights of every branch of the Legislature."

Refolve.

Resolved, That the said Address be presented to His Excel-Lency the Lieutenant Governor by the whole House.

On motion made and seconded—The House resolved itself into a committee of the whole House on the consideration of the correspondence between the committee appointed for that purpose and the Agent of the province—
