So it passed in the negative.

And the House then resumed the Debate on the Resolution proposed by the Honorable Sir E. P. Tache.

Whereupon the Honorable Mr. Dickson moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Currie,

That further Debate on the said motion be postponed until to-morrow, and that it do then stand as the first item upon the Orders of the Day.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the House divided; and the names being called for, they were taken down as follow:
