

CHAP. I.

An Act to repeal an Act passed in the first year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to regulate the Commercial Intercourse between this Province and the United States of America, by land and inland navigation," and further to regulate the Trade between this Province and the United States of America, by land and inland navigation.

Preamble.

[Passed 14th April, 1821.]

THEREAS it is expedient further to provide for the Commercial Intercourse between this Province and the United States of America, and to repeal the laws now in force relative thereto: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, entitled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, That an Act of the Parliament of this Province, passed in the first year of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled "An Act to regulate the Commercial Intercoure between this Province and the United States of America, by land and inland navigation," be and the same is hereby repealed.
