George T. Atkins and Caroline Martin Have Passed Away

(From our own correspondent)
Paris, Aug. 21.—Mr. Kingsley N. Tréhand, who for the past year, has so ably filled the position as organist and choirmaster of the Methodist Church here, was suitably remembered by his friends in the church, by an address and a gold watch and chain. This remembrance was in appreciation of his valuable services in connection with his duties while here. Mr. Tréhand, while in town, made a great many friends, and was a general favorite with all, and carries with him their best wishes for every success in his new home at Pictou, where he has accepted a position as organist in the First Methodist Church.

The death took place this morning at "Gilstone" Paris, the residence of his son-in-law, Mr. R. E. Crombie, of an old and highly esteemed resident, in the person of Mr. Geo. T. Atkins, in his 73rd year. The funeral will take place on Wednesday at 2.30 o'clock p.m. to St. James Church, and thence to St. James Cemetery.

A very pretty wedding took place this afternoon at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Edwin Reynolds, King St., when their only daughter, Margaret, was united in marriage to Mr. Arthur Whitbread, nephew of Mr. A. C. Whitbread of the Customs department, Paris. Promptly at 2.30 p.m., the bride entered the parlor with her father, who gave her away, and looked sweet and girlish in her wedding gown of white silk, with trimmings of lace and satin, with a veil caught up with rose-buds, and carrying a bouquet of white roses. Miss Jean Randall played Lohengrin's wedding march, and sang "Love's Coronation" during the signing of the register. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Mr. Light of Brantford. A dainty repast was served, the table decorations being pink and green. Later the bride changed her wedding gown for her travelling suit of green, with white hat, and left with her husband for a trip to Gordon Bay, Muskoka. On their return, Mr. and Mrs. Whitbread will reside in Paris. Many beautiful gifts were received, showing the high esteem in which they were held by their friends.

AUSTRIAN OFFICIAL

By Special Wire to the Courier.
Berlin, Aug. 23.—(By wireless to Sayville)—The Russians are continuing efforts to force their way across the Carpathians through the pass south of Kolomena, near the Bukovina border, but are meeting with effective resistance from the Teutonic troops there, according to the Austro-Hungarian statement of Aug. 21.

The situation in Galicia north of the Dniester River is reported quiet, while the Russians are declared to have failed in their attempts to gain ground on the west bank of the Stokhod in Volhynia. The statement follows:

"Front of Archduke Charles Francis: 'West of the Moldava, Bukovina, on the heights south and southwest of Zabie, where during our occupation two officers, 188 men and five machine guns were brought in, the enemy made vain attempts to regain lost ground. On both sides of Tarnopol the fighting is continuing with the situation unchanged.'"

"On the railroad south of Wieleone a hostile detachment was repulsed."

"On the BystrizzaHow-overska (south of Stanislau, Galicia, and north of Dniester the situation is quiet.)"

"Front of Field Marshal Von Hindenburg: 'Near Smolary (in the Stokhod region, near the Kovel-Sarny railroad) and south of Stobychiva, we conducted minor successful enterprises. Near Ruska-Yzervissocoe all Russian attempts to enlarge their positions on the west bank of the Stokhod broke down under heavy losses.'"

A METHODICAL WORK IS TAKING ENEMY LINES

Officer Tells Graphic Story of Capture of Longueval and Delville.

TERRIFIC FIRE FROM BIG GUNS. Then the Rush, and Systematic Clearing of Hun Dug-Outs.

London, Aug. 23.—Lieut. W. H. Scott, Black Watch, who was wounded in the course of the British offensive in July, gives the following account of the capture of Longueval and Delville Wood, which was captured by the British on July 18, 1916.

"At home people read that announcement and probably thought that this attack was one of a series and very much the same as the attacks that preceded this, since July 1. But the fight for Longueval and Delville Wood was an entirely different affair. Part of Troues Wood was still in the hands of the enemy, while the German second line was 1,000 yards distant from our newly captured position at Bernafay Wood."

"The general scheme and detail for the attack was perfect and went through without a hitch. The attacking battalions were of the Black Watch and the Argyle and Sutherland Highlanders. At 3 a.m. these battalions had taken up position, having marched up as if on parade while the Germans swept their ranks with heavy shells, and the flanks annoyed by rifle fire from Waterlot Farm and Troues Wood."

"However at 3.05 a.m. all the men were drawn up in a series of waves two to three deep. I went on and the first wave being only 120 yards from the German trenches, while a Boche listening post lay much nearer. Hardly a sound was made or heard, for the men were ordered to discard any surplus kit or anything that would hamper them in the attack. As the men took up position they lay down on the grass, making themselves as small as possible."

"Pumping Steel into Enemy—'Not a movement was heard except the groan of a man here and there, who had been struck by shrapnel or bullet, until 3.25 a.m., when our artillery and the French guns opened upon the German lines. Every gun for miles around blazed and pumped iron and steel on the German trenches and the village. It was a terrifying spectacle. Huge pieces of our own heavy shell blew back over our heads, while the crash and rending of houses and ammunition stores in the German lines was fearful. It was the most complete and successful bombardment of the whole war, in fact our general staff had warned us not to get too close as the artillery work would be noisy and the noise would be heard by the enemy. At 3.30 a.m. the artillery shells the cross roads in the village, while our infantry steadily wave by wave leaped to its feet, and, not at a run, but in ordinary quick time, marched on the German trenches."



MR. TOMMY MOLE


