MRS. JAMES CLARK, 1820-1920

The oldest person in the county, probably the oldest in the province, and possibly the oldest in the Dominion, passed peacefully to her eternal reward on the evening of the 7th, in the person of Mrs. James Clark of Carletonville, N. B. Mrs. Clark had been in her usual good health, receiving her friends in her customary good spirits until the Thursday preceding her demise, when she fell into a coma, from which she never regained consciousness. In this gentle manner the messenger came and bore silently away the happy spirit that had animated a frail earthly frame for nearly a century, for had the good lady lived until September she would have reached the great age of one hundred years. Her relatives and many friends have a great many times voiced the hope that she might be spared until her birthday, so that fitting notice might be taken in celebrating the birthday of one so rich in years. She had the unique experience of having lived during the reigns of six British sovereigns, and one can only grasp the appalling sense of her real length of days when he considers the amazing array of changes and improvements since, on a pleasant autumn morn in September, 1820, Lucy Burt was born in Jacksonville, the first female child to be born in that vicinity. Here her girlhood days were spent, until in the early '40's she was married to James Clark of Keswick. Their early married life was spent in Woodstock, later moving to Florenceville, where they lived five years, and still later to Carletonville in 1868, where they had since resided. After over 70 years of married life Mr. Clark pre-deceased her in 1916, at the age of 96, they having been both born in the same year. All their declining years were spent with their son, Ludlow B. Clark, who through all this long period, liberally, pleasantly and painstakingly administered kindly to all the frailties and whimsicalities that flesh, and especially old age, is heir to. He alone is left of a family of ten children, seven of whom grew up to man's estate. A brother, David Burt, died last summer, well over 90 years of age. The venerable lady will be much missed, both in the immediate family circle and by her large following of friends, most of whom were young while she was already old. Despite the weight of years no marked evidences of senility were there. Only last summer she was able to go about in a motor car, and looking at the old places she knew so well when life was young.

The funeral services were held from the home of her son, Ludlow, on Tuesday afternoon, and at the United Baptist Church, in which she had spent a lifetime of consistent membership. Rev. Samuel Johnson conducted the services, speaking from Numbers 10:28, and was assisted by Rev. Milton Addison. The earthly house, tenanted so long by this valiant spirit, was then laid tenderly and respectfully away in the family lot in the adjacent cemetery.

Fraser Buy Out Geo. W. Upham

Fraser Companies have about completed the purchase of the property of the Upham Lumber Company, consisting of two well equipped mills and a considerable tract of the New Brunswick Railway Company's lands in Victoria county, held under lease. George W. Upham, ex-M. P. P., of Woodstock, manager and president of the company, was in Fredericton last week in connection with the sale. The price is said to be in the vicinity of \$100,000. The mills are located near to Summit on the line of the N. T. R.

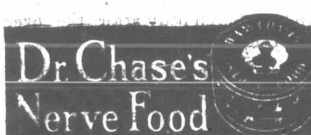
