THE POUND STERLING.

The unprecedented fall in the rate of exchange of the English pound in New York is causing grave concern, and is liable to lead to a serious interruption in the trade of the two countries. The cause of the depreciation is rather difficult to explain. The effect is just as easily underin New York has dropped in value when the English sovereign exchangover \$52,000. The difference in the rate of exchange has added more than two thousand dollars to the cost of the order. Seeing that orders for millions of dollars have been placed with American houses, the seriousness of the situation will be readily appreciated. Wherever it is possible business between the two countries if not brought to a standstill will at least be considerably diminished. and the most curious thing about it all is that so far as we know there is no reason for it. If it is due to the operations of financial plungers and manipulators, then they are guilty of a serious disservice to both countries. In ordinary times the position of Great Britain in the trade relations of the two countries has always been that of the creditor. As a result the balance of credit has been shifted from London to New York, or at least American credit in London has increased while British credit in New York has correspondingly decreased. There is no question of British solvency involved, and it may be that apart from this perfectly legitimate trade fluctuation with its resultant effect on credit, financial gamblers have invaded the field. In any event it should not be difficult to correct. Synopsis of Coal Mining! Regulations.

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Al-berts, the Yukon Territory, the North-west Territories and in a por-tion of the Province of British Col-umbia may be lessed for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1. an acre. Not more than 3,560

acres will be leased to one applicant.
Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-agent in the district in which the rights applied for

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal sub-divisions of sections, and in un surveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the appli-

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be re-funded if the rights applied for are not available. but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the merch antable output of the mine at the

rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of merchantable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal mining rights are not being operated, such returns should be furnished at least

once a year.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only, but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$18.00 an
