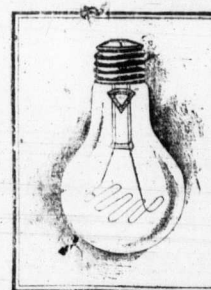

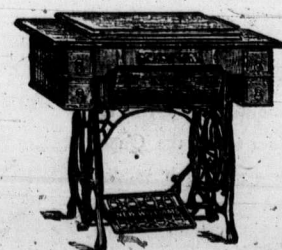

LABOR DIFFICULTIES.

Men Working on C. P. R. Elevators Demand an Increase of Pay.

Only Last Monday They Received an Increase and Now Come Back for More.

THE GRAND TRUNK AND SWITCHMEN.

FORT WILIAM, Ont., Oct. 5.—Unless the wages of the night shifts on the C. P. R. elevators are immediately increased five cents an hour there will be a strike, and as the day shifts will go out in sympathy, a danger threatens the free movement of the wheat unless the Company give way. Last Monday the employees demanded and received a five cents raise and now they insist on another. The men are getting 25 cents at present.

Grand Trunk Switchmen.
CHICAGO, Oct. 5.—The convention between the officials of the Grand Trunk

Railway and the officers of the Switchmen's Union over the grievances of the fifty men who walked out last week in this city was broken off last night, with no agreement in sight. The men were satisfied with working conditions, but demanded an agreement for the re-installment of three men who had been discharged. The railroad declared that the three were chronic disturbers and would not again be employed and declined to make an agreement with the Union. It agreed, however, to maintain the present conditions in the yards, which are satisfactory to the switchmen.

WANT THE NORTH WEST BRAND.

Great British Cooperative Societies Sending Representatives to Spy Out the Land.

TORONTO, Ont., Oct. 5.—T. C. McNab and W. F. Stewart of Leith, Scotland, Director and Manager respectively of the Scottish Wholesale Co-operative Society, and John Gledhill, of New York, American representative of Great Cooperative Wholesale Society of England, are in the city on their way to the Canadian West. The societies named own quite a number of flour mills, the produce of

which is used by retail co-operative societies affiliated with and holding stock in the wholesale. Heretofore a large part of the supplies have come from Odessa and from Duluth, Wheat from the Northwest States, however, is no longer as useful for their purposes as it was, and in view of these conditions co-operatives have sent out their experts to report on Manitoba wheat.

DOUKHOUBOURS ON THE MARCH.

A Party of Twenty Rounded Up at Rostern, Man.

And Escorted Home by Mounted Police.

Their Opinion of Rostern and the Mounted Police.

ROSTERN, Man., Oct. 5.—A Doukhobour party numbering about twenty, brought here on Tuesday night's train, were taken in charge by the local Mounted Police and escorted back to their villages yesterday morning. The party comprised men, women and children, and kept up a continuous chant. They were marched through the Rostern streets. They were arrested near Yorkton, having travelled the whole distance, about 300 miles, on foot, avoiding all towns and villages on the way. The Doukhobours designated Rostern as hell, and their Mounted Police escort as devils.

PARIS, Oct. 5.—Professor Behring, the discoverer of the anti-diphtheria serum, announces, according to the Matin, that he has found a cure for tuberculosis.

TARIFF COMMISSION

Will Finish Up Their Enquiries in British Columbia Today.

VICTORIA, Oct. 5.—The Tariff Commission arrived here last night and will conclude their British Columbia enquiry at the meeting here today. It is not expected that much evidence will be offered, as the Board of Trade will leave the representation to industrial efforts. It is expected that the New England Fish Company will ask that young oysters be admitted free for cultivation in their beds on the Pacific. Yesterday morning the Ministers inspected the large saw mills at Vancouver, and were surprised to see large schooners loading for five different countries—Japan, Australia, Chili, England and Germany.

CANADIAN STOCK MARKET.

Buyers Still Keep Prices Up on the Montreal Exchange.

Montreal Power Steady Around 94 1/2.

The Prices Quoted for the Principal Stocks Listed on Change.

MONTREAL, Oct. 5.—There were no special features in the stock market today, but the tone continued strong at the best level of the past few days. Some of the most prominent trading was in Montreal Power at 94 1/2; Mackay 46; Pfd. 75; Montreal Street Railway, 27; Dominion Iron, 23; Pfd., 25; Havana Pfd., 71; Toledo Elec., 35; and Detroit United, 40.

DISGRACEFUL AFFAIR

Authorities to Investigate Free Fight Which Took Place in Ontario Church.

ST. THOMAS, Oct. 5.—The Crown will investigate the disgraceful scene which took place in the Baptist Church near Port Burwell during a business meeting at the close of the regular service on Sunday evening, Sept. 21th. Information has been laid against all those who are said to have participated in the affair and those have been summoned to appear at Town Hall in Port Burwell, when County Magistrate Hunt will proceed, and Crown Attorney McTernan will represent the Crown. According to reports received the fight was a most disgraceful affair, and the combatants attacked each other with such fury that the church where the fight took place looked, it is said, like a butcher shop.
