"A most successful year, notwithstanding the general depression." This is the pleasing statement contained in the sixth annual report of the Canadian Pacific Railway Centre of the St. John Ambulance association. For the twelve months, ending September 30, 1915, no less than 1,816 passed qualifying examinations out of a total of 2,564 who presented themselves for instruction at the classes.

In all the departments of the C.P.R. Centre of the association, which spreads over the country, a greater zeal than ever was manifested for work, and the support of the superintending officials of the C.P.R. is in no small way responsible for a good deal of the advancement made. Wives and daughters of C.P.R. employees have taken advantage of the free course of training offered, and now no less than 825 ladies have taken out the certificate of qualification from the associa-

Under the auspices of the C. P. R. Centre instruction was given to the Borden Battery and Ammunition Column before leaving Montreal for the frent. Afterwards the certificates of merit were presented to the officers and men by His Royal Highness the

Dake of Connaught.

An important feature of the work of the C.P.R. Centre was the bringing of a large number of the lady clerks of the C.P.R. into touch with the Red Cross Society, an organization to which they proved a valuabe asset.

Three men were saved from drowning at Winnipeg by W. T. Davies, C. P. R. ambulance instructor, and Wiliam Newcombe, a C.P.R. constable. Sir Donald Cameron presented the medal of the Royal Canadian Humane Society to each in recognition of their

bravery.
Particulars were obtainable of 3,780 cases where first aid had been administered by members of the C.P.R. Centre. The cases were thus divided: Atlantic Centre, 9; Eastern Division, 130; Ontario Division, 136; western lines, 3,440.

Concluding the report the C.P.R. Centre pays a glowing tribute to the late Lleutenant-Colonel Lacy R. Johnson, who had been chairman of the Centre under review and also of the whole association. During his time as chairman nearly 7,000 employes of the C.P.R. passed the qualifying examinations, and in this way made themselves better citizens of the Dominion.

SOME VETERAN RACE HORSES Budweiser Showed Quality of Modern Day Sprinters on American Turf

these days of training yearlings and racing two-year-olds the impression is very general among those not in close touch with turf affairs that thoroughbreds no longer last beyond the age of four or five years except in the age of four or five years except in rare instances, but the furf guides show a great many horses of mature age to be still on the track, and still winning, while not a few real veterans are earning brackets. In racing a horse is deemed to be "aged" after his sixth year. Among pinety-two aged horses in a list of winners of \$10,000 or more recently published in Racing Form here were thirty-two that added to their earnings last season at the age of seven, eighteen at eight, twenty-one of seven, eighteen at eight, twenty-one at nine, eleven at ten, seven at eleven, one at twelve and two at thirteen

years of age.

Convincing proof of the wear-andtear qualities of some of the modern
sprinters was afforded by the victory
of a horse at Juarez, Mexico, a few
weeks age when pincipal years and weeks ago, when nineteen years old, and more recently by the double win of old Budweiser at Hot Springs, Ark. He is sixteen years old and has been trained ever since he was a two-year-

The record of the Texas horse No Quarter, by Viking, out of Sweet Danger, by Deceiver, is remarkable in the number of races he has run. Foaled in 1904, this bay thoroughbred had to the close of last season started 361 times and had won 61 races, worth \$16,342. Philip Stevenson's Lad of Langdon, the same age, had taken part in 249 races and Black Mate, another veteran of the vintage of 1904, is credted with 262 starts.

Herculoid, a horse owned by Peter Hauck, Jr., is one of the oldest two runners now in training that have earned \$10,000 or more. The other is Caper Sauce, hero of 183 races. Both were foaled in 1902. Borrow (7), Guy Fisher (9), Sir John Johnson (10), Iron Mask (7), and some others in the list are recognized as high class horses in almost any company. Guy Fisher is credited with 255 races, of which he has won forty-nine, worth \$34,000. Borrow's winnings in England and America exceed \$60,000, putting him at the head of the list of aged winners now in training.

GIRL SETS MARK FOR BALL THROW Milwaukee, Wis., June 22.-The world's record for throwing a basebal by a girl, 227 feet, a figure established at Madison this spring, was broken at Milwaukee Downer College, a school for girls, when Miss Elizabeth Faville of Lake Mills, threw the ball 228 feet.

The throw was far below the figures she has established in practice, the college girls declaring she has achiev-ed 240 feet in practice since reading of the Wisconsin girl's record.
