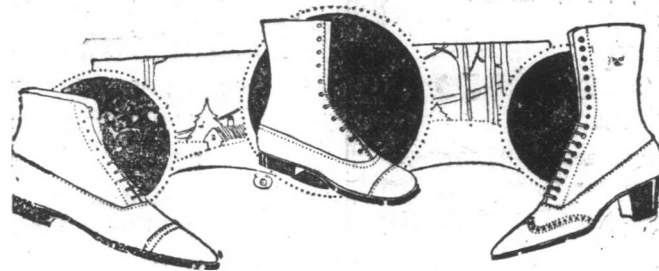

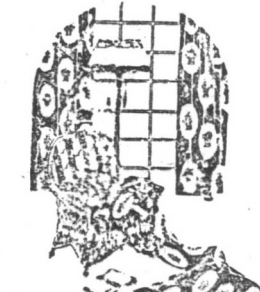

Diocesan Synod Proceedings.

THURSDAY, Sept. 22.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The House was called to order at 3.30 by His Lordship the Bishop, who read the opening prayers. The roll having been called, the House proceeded to business. Minutes of yesterday's session were read and approved and signed.

Canon Bolt presented the report of the Ordination Candidates' Fund. On motion the report was received and adopted.

Rev. T. E. Loder, Grand Falls, moved second reading of Bills to amend Chapters I, VII and IX. of the Constitution and Rules.

Mr. Loder explained that the bills were interdependent, and therefore he wished to have them taken together. The aim of the bills was the alteration of the status of a voter or speaker at a parish meeting, making the monetary standard \$3.00 instead of \$2.00, and making residence in a parish or mission for a full year necessary before speaking or voting. House agreed.

Rev. T. E. Loder moved the House into Committee of the Whole to consider the matter.

The House went into Committee. The House in Committee agreed to the amendments proposed.

Mr. Loder moved that the committee rise and report the bill passed. Agreed. Committee rose.

Mr. Loder gave notice that he would on to-morrow move that the bill be read a third time and passed.

Mr. H. S. Hayward moved the adoption of the Report of the Diocesan Board of Religious Education. On being duly seconded, it was agreed.

On motion the House adjourned at 5.30.

NIGHT SESSION.

The House resumed at 7.30, the Lord Bishop presiding. Prayers were read by the President. Rolls were called, and the Synod proceeded to business.

His Lordship read a letter from Rev. Canon Kuhring of St. John, New Brunswick, who visited Newfoundland this summer in the interest of the British and Foreign Bible Society, expressing to the Bishop, Clergy and Laity of the Church in Newfoundland a sense of his gratitude for the many kindnesses received during his tour of nearly a month in Newfoundland.

His Lordship intimated that inasmuch as many other important matters have yet to be considered he would request outport clergy and lay delegates to try and remain in St. John's over the coming Sunday, and that as Bishop he would excuse the clergy from any obligation that they felt they should return to their parishes and mission before Sunday.

His Lordship also read an emission from his charge delivered at the beginning of the session. In reference to the death of George H. Davey and of his real and valuable services as a son of our Church. His affection for the Mother Church of which he was churchwarden, his sympathy for our orphans, his requests to the orphanage and to Diocesan and Parish funds, witness to the largeness of his heart and the sincerity of his devotion to his Church.

Mr. Brian Dunfield moved the House into Committee of the Whole for the continuance of the debate on the Resolutions on Education. Agreed.

The discussion on the Resolutions continued until midnight, the following members taking part therein, viz: Revs. A. E. Butler, T. E. Loder, Canon Bolt, J. T. Hiscock, H. V. Whitehouse, Canon Bayly, Canon Smart, Dr. Facey and Messrs. Reginald Dowden, Aaron Stone, R. R. Wood, S. D. Blandford and M. G. Winter.

At midnight, on motion, the committee rose, reported progress and asked leave to sit again at 7.30 to-morrow.

The Committee rose. On motion the House adjourned, the Bishop pronouncing the Benediction.
