Shipbuilders and Employers Consider the Industrial Situation

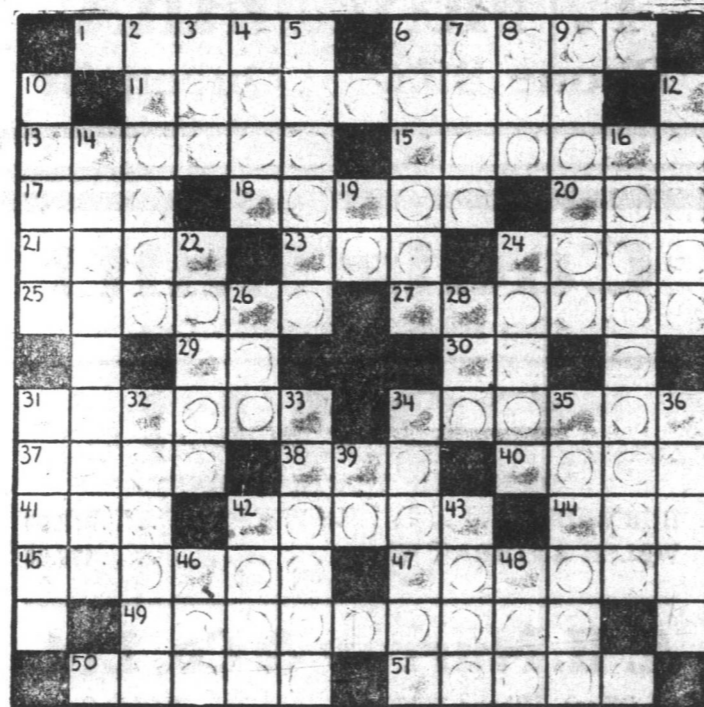
A joint committee of employers and workmen, representing the Shipbuilding Employees Federation and the shipyard trades unions, has been meeting in Edinburgh with a view to discovering ways and means to remedy the shipbuilding situation in Great Britain. According to advices received by Bankers Trust Company of New York, from its British Information Service, these meetings have been brought about because of the fact that large orders for ships for British owners, have, within the last few months, been placed on the continent. The joint committee are endeavoring to discover a method by which this competition can be met. Mr. E. F. Mulheron, managing director of the Tyne Iron Shipbuilding Company, in an address at the launching of the ship "Redriff," advanced the idea that an import duty should be put on vessels built abroad for British owners, claiming that the British government should not allow English money to go abroad while British workmen were starving. Another British authority of shipbuilding said, "It is a serious matter for our shipbuilding industry, that orders for British ships should be going abroad. It is more serious still to know that until by some means, not easily arrived at, shipbuilding costs in this country can be reduced to a level with those Germany and Holland, and just now we must add, in France—there is danger of additional orders leaving our shores. The exasperation of British builders and their working

staffs over this diversion of orders so much needed at home, can be well understood and indeed regarded with whole-hearted sympathy. It is idle to blame shipbuilders for placing their orders abroad after they have shown their reluctance to do so and have, in fact, taken every possible step to keep their work at home. The initial cost of a ship is a vital consideration to shipowners to-day. It may decide as it often has done, whether he shall build or not build. . . . The remedy is not what Mr. Mulheron propounds an import duty on British ships built abroad would not only be in direct contravention to the considered and established fiscal policy of this country, but it would fall to effect a permanent recovery in our shipbuilding trade. The only remedy, and the remedy which must be found, is to build ships as cheaply as our rivals." By implication, this rather indicates that the real underlying difficulty in the situation is that the wages paid to workmen in the shipbuilding and shipping trades are too high and will have to be reduced if foreign competition is to be met.

Our Navy's Deadly Nests of Wasps

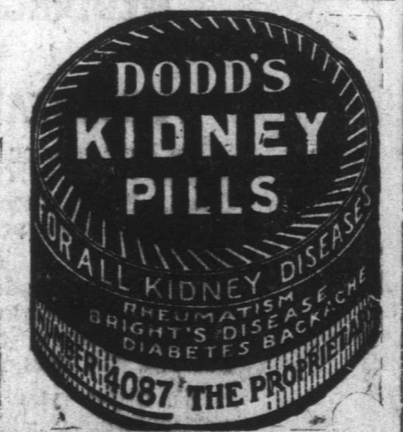
The "Saratoga"—World's Mightiest Airplane Carrier.

When the world's greatest airplane carrier, the Saratoga, slid down the ways at Camden, N.J., a few weeks ago, Secretary of the Navy Wilbur characterized her as "designed to take her deadly brood of wasps far ahead of the fleet, within scouting range of the enemy, or where her bomb-carriers can attempt to destroy enemy battle fleets."

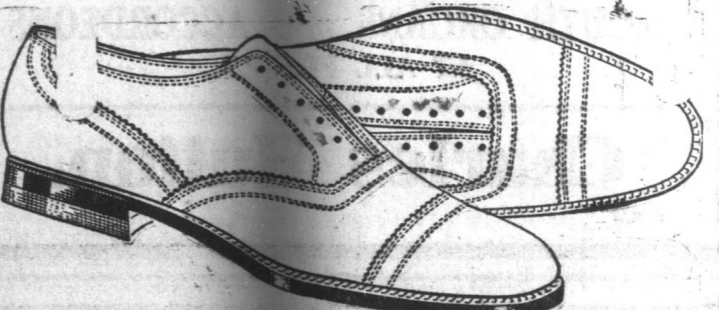
Carrying a buzzing swarm of 73 fighting planes—32 bombers and 40 combat machines—she will represent, when completed, the last word in naval construction.
Not only is the Saratoga the world's largest craft afloat (her length is 888 feet) and she is driven by the most powerful engines ever put into a vessel. The immense sweep of her vast flying-deck is broken only by a massive combination funnel enclosure, set off at the side of the hull.
Eight electric motors driven by current supplied by four immense steam

turbines, and capable of developing 180,000 horse-power, will drive her through the water at a speed of 39 miles an hour. She is speedier than any battleship afloat, and only modern cruisers and destroyers can keep pace with her. Although practically unarmored her potential destructive force is greater than the guns of the greatest dreadnaught. Her sister ship, the Lexington, will be launched next fall.

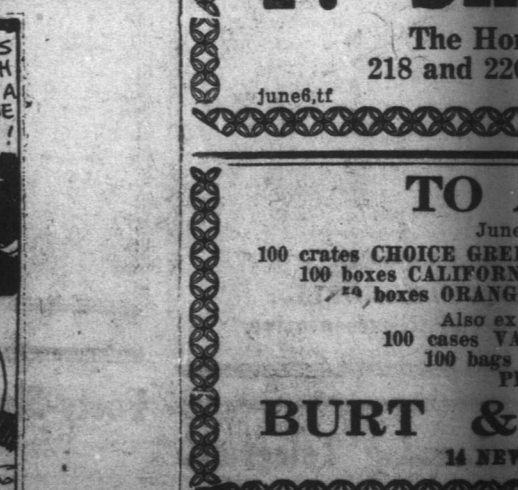
