

ROSEBERY'S TRIBUTE TO BRITAIN'S KING

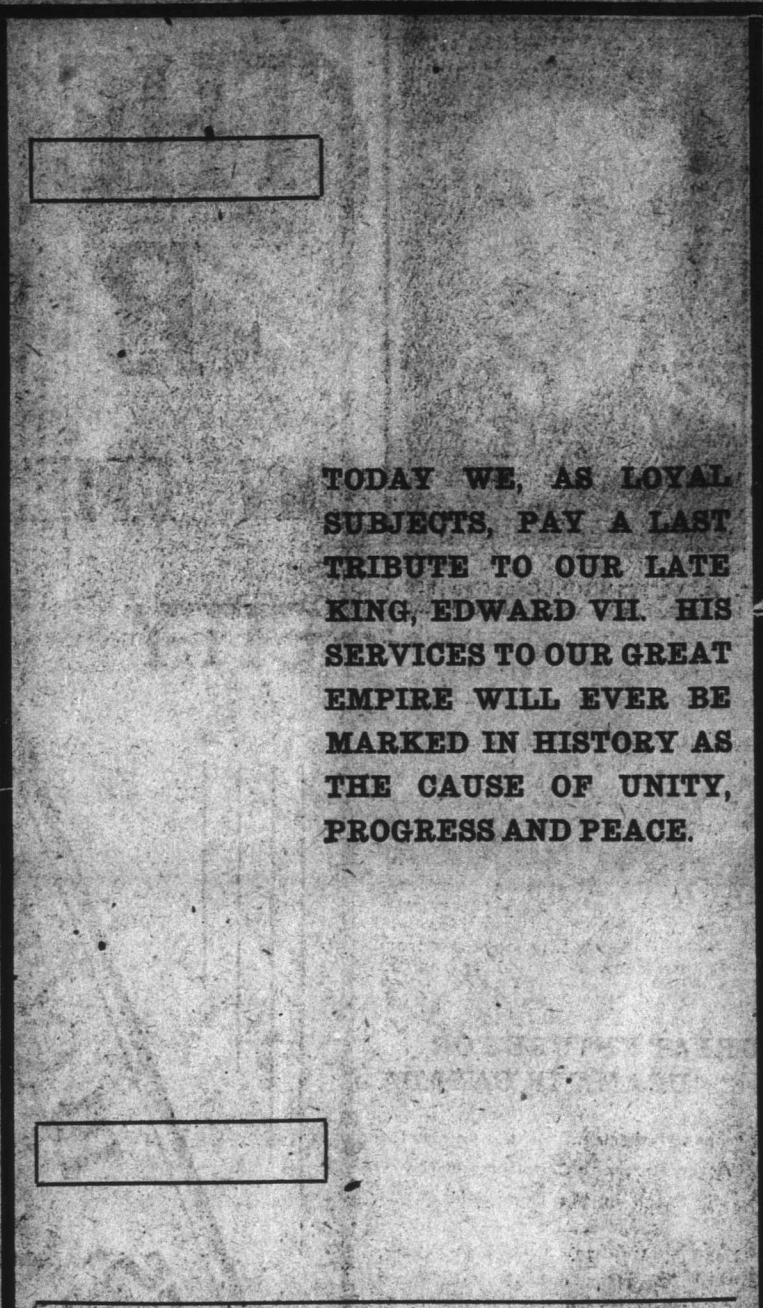
A Good Husband, a Good Father,
Has Led Pure and Abstemious
Life. Will be Good King.

London, May 19.—Lord Rosebery at a meeting of the Scottish Corporation yesterday paid an eloquent tribute to the memory of King Edward. "I might look with real awe and real confidence," he continued, "to the reign of the new ruler, King George, had led the life of a saint and a devoted lover of his subjects. He had led a pure, healthy, abstemious life. He was a good husband and a good father. He would exhibit the virtues of the domestic virtues which are dear to this country. He had explored every region of the empire over which he was called to rule more than a hundred sovereign in the long life of his predecessors. He knew what he had to govern, at home, and he had no regard for pains to make himself acquainted with every phase of political life. It is an endeavor to do his duty to a guarantee of success, that he was sure, would be found in the future of the empire."

**THE BUREAU CHIEFS
STEAL FROM CZAR**
Sensational Disclosures Follow Probe
Into Graft Practices in St.
Petersburg.

St. Petersburg, May 19.—Every bureau chief in St. Petersburg either stole or accepted bribes in connection with Government contracts in the Russo-Japanese war. This statement, made by one of the government investigators today, explains why so many of the officials involved are either fugitives from the country or facing prison sentences. The government is investigating the army supply department in St. Petersburg, Warsaw and Kiev, and the results did far to disclose a worse condition of affairs than was found in Moscow, Kazan and in Tientsin, which was sufficient to raise a wholesale stake-up in the government circles.

The investigators have found that government officials, alarmed at the prospect of an early termination of the war ending their graft, did everything possible to prolong the struggle. One favorite form of graft was to send to the front spoiled stores, bought for practically nothing, and pocket the bulk of the money paid out by the Government. Considered at the front would report that the goods had spoiled in transit. Many officials amassed fortunes by renting freight cars, charging the government to provide shipments at from \$100 to \$500 each. Millions of dollars worth of goods shipped as military supplies, but were never purchased. Watchmen over army stores, riddled their plundering so profitable that they paid as high as \$200 a month to avoid being promoted to positions with larger salaries. At Kiev, where the soldiers admitted taking bribes of from \$200 to \$500 on each shipment, turned

ROSEBERY'S PARTY

Lord Rosebery's proposal to drop tariff reform at the coming general election still continues to find influential supporters. The latest to come forward are Lord Avebury, the Marquis of Salisbury, Lord Graham, Lord Rosebery, although he is a convinced tariff reformer. Lord Salisbury describes himself as a "very unorthodox tariff reformer," and he declares that the Unionist policy plus tariff reform gives no assurance of support in the country. Lord Avebury agrees with this view and says that Unionists will not secure a majority so long as they propose to tamper with free trade.

King of Gypsy Violinists Dead.

Budapest—Lajos Munczy, the "king of gypsy violinists," died here recently at the age of 83 years, leaving property of the value of about \$400,000. He had played before nearly all European monarchs, including King Edward, and was a particular favorite of the late Empress Elizabeth, who used to listen to his music for hours at a time, and gave him many costly presents.

Harvey W. Wiley, of the bureau of chemistry in Washington, so expressed himself before a packed audience of women attending the biennial federation of domestic clubs in Music Hall this morning, and his hearers made the big building resound with their applause.

"We will," said the speaker, "send a man to the United States senate before he has had training and experience in managing the affairs of state. Do we elect a man to the presidency before he has had training in managing a bank? Do we send young women out to preside over an institution more important and more in need of skilled management? To the last question we can, alas! only answer 'We do.'"
