San Jose, Cal., June 17.—An important discovery regarding the comet has been made at Lick Observatory. Photographic plates reveal the fact that the celestial visitant is not alone in its glory, but has a companion. The second comet is enveloped in the tail of the first one, and shows distinctly as a nebulous-like condensation. Its tail merges into that of the other. Dr. Holden and the astronomers on the mountain are much clated over the discovery, which makes more certain the theory that the original force which throws out comets, sends out more than one at a time.
