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REVAL PUT TO THE TORCH; MOSCOW SETS UP GOVERNMENT

All Political Parties Unite to Act Independently of Imperial Authorities—Martial Law at Kharkoff.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 28.—Serious rioting occurred at Reval last night. This morning the city is ablaze. The theater and spirit shops are burning.

Reval, Russia, Oct. 28.—While the city was in darkness last night rioters sacked the stores and later marching crowds set fire to the spirit shops, theater and other buildings. Barricades were thrown up in various sections, buildings were still in flames this morning. Troops are now arriving here.

Moscow, Oct. 28, 10:33.—At a meeting of delegates representing the different political parties it has been decided to unite in the establishment of a government and to act independently of imperial authorities.

SANG THE MARSEILLAISE.

Demonstration at Kharkoff During Burial of Strike Victims.

Kharkoff, Russia, Oct. 28.—There was a great demonstration at the burial today of the fifteen victims of the recent rioting, but the students and workmen preserved order. The procession marched through the streets without any clergy and singing the "Marseillaise" and dirge music. At the cemetery revolutionary speeches were made over the graves, which were adorned with red flags. The troops and police were powerless to interfere. Subsequently, martial law was declared.

Bomb-Throwing at Gomel.

Gomel, Russia, Oct. 28.—The strikers here today threw a bomb at the chief of police while he was driving through the principal thoroughfare. His carriage was wrecked and the chief and two Cossacks, who were escorting him, were badly injured.

Revolutionaries Want War.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 28.—11:20 a.m.—A condition prevailing upon panic prevails here today. Business is completely suspended. Soldiers are everywhere in the streets and bloodshed on a large scale is feared. The Government is trying to appease the infuriated populace, but the revolutionaries seem determined to force an armed conflict.

The last railroad link connecting the capital with the outside world was broken last night, when the Finland Railroad discontinued service between St. Petersburg and the Finnish border, but communication by water is still open. The cable is still operating, although the postoffice is closed, and the only newspapers to appear today were the Official Messenger and the army organs, which printed directions for the military. The former contained a letter from Gen. Trepoft, who is in command of the St. Petersburg garrison, and addressed to the provisional governors, instructing them to allow public meetings for the discussion of Parliamentary questions, and to interpret the law liberally, under Count Witte's direction. The Government realizes that repression by arms in the tremendously excited state of the country would be fatal, and meetings are allowed as safety valves.

Further meetings at the university have been prohibited, but three buildings have been set aside for meetings in St. Petersburg, and Gen. Trepoft has instructed the governors to select buildings in all the cities.

From all over the empire the story is the same—work stopped, no newspapers printed, schools closed, and the business life of the people suspended. The cry of the masses is always the same—"political liberty." The military everywhere are in possession, the inhabitants are terror-stricken, many cities are in darkness, and at Reval a mob began work last night. The rioters sacked the shops, and this morning the city is on fire. The theater and spirit shops are burning.

Kharkoff is under martial law.

The most startling news, however, comes from Moscow, where all the political parties have joined in a resolution to set up the provisional government.

MARKETS OF BERLIN HARD HIT BY ANARCHY IN RUSSIAN EMPIRE

Berlin, Oct. 28.—The conditions in Russia are beginning to have marked effect on the financial and commercial life of Berlin. The grain market yesterday was widely excited through the interruption of arrivals from Russia, and prices jumped up and down spasmodically. Large stocks of Caucasian wheat and South Russia rye were bought for Berlin account. Wheat opened at \$1.10 for futures and oats at \$1.15 higher. The suspension of the Russian freight movement is doing special damage to German trade because of the unusually heavy stocks of agricultural products which are now due to arrive from Russia. Ashkabad, Russian Trans-Caspian Territory, Oct. 28.—The employees of the Central Asian Railroad have struck.

Irkutsk, Siberia, Oct. 28.—The railway men on the Trans-Baikal line have struck.

Libau, Oct. 28.—All the schools are closed.

Tiflis, Oct. 28.—There is a general strike of every class here. Business is at a standstill. The population is nervous.

Kremenchuk, Oct. 28.—The municipal council has petitioned the Government to remove the Cossacks from the city.

Warsaw, Russian Poland, Oct. 28.—The streets are filled with patrols. It is rumored that strikers are marching on the city from the provinces. By order of the governor-general the gates of Warsaw are closed at dark, and the restaurants close at 7 in the evening.

Sevastopol, Oct. 28.—A great political demonstration took place in the public square here today. Orators harangued the crowds, who later paraded the streets singing revolutionary songs and scattering proclamations. The troops gradually pressed the crowds into the outskirts of the town.

Riga, Oct. 28.—The local authorities have closed the spirit shops and placed them under military guard.

Kiev, Russia, Oct. 28.—The city is in darkness, no mail has been received for days, and the people are the prey to the wildest rumors.

Intense excitement prevails. The publishers have unanimously decided to cease publication. They will send circulars to their subscribers until they are allowed to print the truth.

Outroff, Oct. 28.—Railroad communication here has been stopped. No grain is moving and no papers are being printed.

The Loan Adjourned.

St. Petersburg, Oct. 28, 2 p.m.—It is reported that the negotiations for the new Russian loan have been temporarily adjourned. Finance Minister Kokovtsov has informed the foreign bankers that in view of the present state of affairs in Russia the loan could not be negotiated to advantage, and the Government had decided to wait until the political situation was cleared up.

PATIENT BOLTED FROM HOSPITAL

Smallpox Convalescent Shinned Down Water Pipe Before Time Was Up.

Toronto, Oct. 28.—A little over a week ago John B. Ankeron, a patient at the smallpox hospital, escaped from that institution by climbing down a water pipe about seven days before he would have been discharged. Detectives were placed on his track and it was found that he had taken the train for Owen Sound. A constable boarded the train at Shelbourne and arrested Ankeron, who was brought back in a colicist car, taken to the hospital again and kept for his other week. This morning the man appeared before Magistrate Denison and was fined \$40 and costs.

Spanish Cruiser Founders.

London, Oct. 28.—A dispatch to a news agency from Coruna, Spain, says the Spanish armored cruiser Cardinal Cisneros foundered off Villanova this morning after striking a rock. All on board the vessel were saved.

NEW EXPERIMENTAL FARM

Ontario to Establish North of the Height of Land.

Toronto, Oct. 28.—Hon. Nelson Monteith, Minister of Agriculture, returned this morning from the Temiskaming country. In an interview he stated that the Government in all probability would establish an experimental farm in the clay belt north of the Height of Land, south of the international boundary, and in a suitable climatic conditions will be as far as they will go. Such an institution is not needed, said Mr. Monteith, south of the Height of Land, because agriculture here has already passed the experimental stage.

Smuggler's Daring Escape.

Plattsburgh, N. Y., Oct. 28.—A daring and sensational escape was made late last night by Allen Shaheen, a Turk, and resident of Ontario, from the custody of Deputy United States Marshal Brewster, who was bringing him to this city on a charge of smuggling two emigrants into the United States. Just after the train left West Chazy he leaped through a window and disappeared.

LONDON FIELD BATTERY

Inspection of Equipment Will Take Place on Nov. 25th and 27th.

Ottawa, Oct. 28.—The London Field Battery equipment will be inspected on the 25th and 27th of November.

MAY BE JAP Famine

Rice Crop of Three Prefectures Falls Below Original Estimates.

London, Oct. 28.—The correspondent of the Times at Tokio says the rice crop of Japan is much below the original estimates, and that three prefectures are threatened with famine. The same correspondent says that the Japanese authorities have dispatched a body of troops from Seoul to quell an insurrection in three Korean provinces south of Seoul.

TRANSFER OF GARRISON

Canada Will Take Possession at Halifax November 15.

Ottawa, Oct. 28.—The department of militia has been informed by the war office that the British troops will be withdrawn from the Canadian frontier by the end of the month, and that the Canadian authorities will assume charge of the forts on Nov. 15. This information puts an end to the feeling of uncertainty which has existed a long time regarding the transfer of the Atlantic military frontier to the Canadian authorities.

CUT HER LOVER'S THROAT

Girl Embraced Fickle Admirer and Then Used Razor.

Des Moines, Ia., Oct. 28.—Placing her arms about the neck of her lover, Harold Stepp, and lovingly caressing him, Myrtle Williams, of Albia, last night opened a razor case, before his eyes, and with a single stroke cut his throat. Jealousy was the cause.

WRECKAGE OF KALIYUGA

Was Evidently Making for Shelter of Georgian Bay.

Sarnia, Oct. 28.—The captain of the steamer Kaliyuga, which was wrecked on the shore of Georgian Bay, has arrived at Sarnia, and has reported that he passed a pilotboat, 40 miles off the shore of Georgian Bay, and that the wrecked vessel was seen to be making for the shore of Georgian Bay. The sea was running so heavy he was unable to examine the wreckage, but there seemed to be no doubt that it was the missing steamer Kaliyuga, and that Capt. Togni was making an effort to reach Georgian Bay for shelter when his vessel went down.

CLEARING THE WAY FOR TRACTION LINE

Southwestern Is Getting Things Ready for Track-Laying Inside the City.

The Southwestern Traction Company is making ready for the building of its line into the city from Westminster Township.

Already the ties and rails have been laid as far as Mr. Thomas McCormick's property on Grand avenue, South London, and the construction has almost reached that point.

One abutment for the bridge to span the river at the foot of Richmond street is finished, and no time is to be lost in doing the remainder of the work.

When the bridge site and the site of the station on Simcoe street, between Richmond and Clarence, houses are being moved to make way for the track, and in a short time work may be commenced on the depot.

It was stated today that the arrival of spring will find the company ready to open lines between this city and Fort Stanley.

THE BONUS ON IMMIGRANTS

Salvation Army Want It Paid On Those Not Farmers.

Ottawa, Oct. 28.—Commissioner Coombs, of the Salvation Army, is coming to Ottawa to discuss with the immigration authorities the payment of a bonus for immigrants sent from Great Britain to Canada. The army is paid 12 shillings on every adult male immigrant, and 6 shillings on every child under 16 years of age. The bonus is paid to the army, and is subject to a duty of \$1.50 per gallon.
