NEW RISK IN MARRIAGE. [Brooklyn Times.]

It must be remembered that New York is probably the most strict state in its marriage laws. It grants an absolute divorce for only one reason, and the charge must be clearly proved and by competent witnesses, whether the defendant puts in an answer or not. If Justice Dowling's rulings were more liberal to Mr. Gould's side, the peace and continued existence of a great many martial unions would soon be attacked.
