Lay Claim For Bond Guarantee Before the Finance Committee.

SEEK AN ENTRANCE

Would Be Willing to Accept That In. stead of the Guarantees-Matter Laid Over.

At a special meeting of the finance committee of the city council held yesterday afternoon, Mr. D. A. Stewart and Mr. A. E. Weich, on behalf of the London and Northwestern Railway and the North Midland Railway, respectively, laid their case before the committee, and asked that the council submit a bylaw to the ratepayers in January to guarantee a certain portion of their bonds. As there was no quorum the matter will stand over for a day or two, when another meeting will be held to finally dispose of the matter. It is quite likely that the bylaw will be submitted.

Mr. D. A. Stewart, speaking for the London and Northwestern, said desired the city to guarantee \$150,000 worth of bonds. The total cost of construction would be \$18,000 a mile. or \$1,224,000 for the 68 miles of road. This included equipment. It was his guarantee \$250,000 of this issue, and London had been apportioned \$150,000. The city would be placed on a level with other bond holders. Mr. Stewart thought his request reasonable. presented plans of his road, and a detailed statement of the probable cost.

Some discussion took place as to the advisability of issuing half the bonds as first mortgage securities, and securing the balance on second mortgage bonds, or preferred stock. Mr. Stewart offered some saying that it would be impossible to issue second mortgage bonds or preferred stock, and obtain a good price.
