Mrs. Becker was presented with the medal of the American Humane Association, but, as far as records show, no Canadian memorial exists.

The third woman, whom I have selected, won her fame while still a slip of a girl. I refer to Marie Made-leine, daughter of Francois de Ver-cheres, who was born near Montreal in 1678. 
