FRENCH MEDAL IS
GIVEN FOR BRAVERY

Lieut. Andre Ruel, Sarnia Soldier, Decorated For Meritorious Service.

IS NOW WITH AVIATORS

All But 48 of His Company Killed by Bursting Shells.

SARNIA, Dec. 10.—Lieut. Andre Ruel, who several months ago left for France in answer to his country's call, has been decorated with the French medal for bravery on the battlefield. This information was contained in a letter which Mrs. Ruel received today. There are many more incidents mentioned in the letter, but in relating them there is no boasting, merely experiences through which he has passed as but part of the day's work.

Ruel talked of the matter, but when it was pointed out to her that it was nothing more than fair that a deserved tribute should be paid to a man who had faced the dangers through which Lieut. Ruel had passed, she agreed to give out the contents of the letter.

Named An Interpreter. When Lieut. Ruel arrived in France his knowledge of several languages brought about his appointment as interpreter, and his duties were to carry

STRONG PRESS OPINION

Empire's Development Depends on Colonial Freedom.

TORONTO, Dec. 10.—The Star prints a special cable from London, as follows: "Statements here in all parties are realizing that the war has proved the correctness of the Canadian Liberal position on the naval defence question. The Morning Post, in a remarkable editorial, today, declares: 'It would no doubt be invidious to compare the share of the crown colonies with the share of the dominions in the common task, but this much may be said: What has been and is being done is the voluntary, spontaneous effort inspired by local genius and the spirit of the particular country concerned, and not imposed upon it by Whitehall.'"
