In one section of the warehouse were large quantities of special kraft paper used by the board. It is bought in quantities of five carloads at a time. I inspected the room where al kinds of liquor offered to the government board are tasted and analyzed, and another room where a water distilling apparatus is kept for forcing distilled water into overproof liquors. I passed the room where an expert Scotch taster determines whether the five malts all are present in liquor in the right quantities.
