old, may homestead a quarter section
of available Dompinion land in Manitoba. Saskatchewan or Alberta. The
applicant must appear in person at
the Domlinon Lands Agency or SubAgency for the district. Entry by
proxy may be made at any agency,
on certain conditions, by father, motaer, son, daughter, brother or sister of
intending homesteader.
Duties.—Six months' residence upon
and cultivation of the land in each of
three years. A homesteader may live
within nine miles of his homestead on
a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by hint or by his
