Suit For Non-Support By a 15-Year-Old Wife.

Savannah, N.Y., Aug. 7.—Byron Davis of Clyde, a boy, was tried before Justice John H. Bixley to-day on the charge of failing to support his wife. He was found guilty and was ordered to pay his wife \$1.25 a week until a child is born, after which the amount must be increased.

The remarkable feature of the case is the fact that the wife is only 15 years old, and the husband one year younger. The wife's maiden name was Nelhe Tayor. She eloped from Savannah with Young Davis last May, after a very short acquaintance, and lived happily with him for a time at the home of his father, who is a saloonkeeper.

But her mother-in-law began to interfere with her and to wean her young husband from her. After making life as unpleasant as possible, and finding that even then the girl refused to leave, she finally sent her son out of town altogether, and ordered her daughter-in-law out of the house.

She came back to Savannah and has lived at her father's ever since. Meanwhile she brought suit against her husband for non-support.

ROBBERY BY BRIGANDS.

New York, Aug. 7.—A special from San Francisco says: T. Salaveria, a rich ooffee planter of Salvador, arrived here on the Panama steamer yesterday and told a sensational story of robbery by brigands at his coffee plantation, 60 miles from San Salvador. A band of 150 brigands in June swooped down on the place, and, after binding and beating Salaveria and his aged wife, secured \$26,000 in coin. This money had been provided to pay the coffee pickers. The robbers also stripped the house of jewelry worth several thousand dollars. Salaveria traced them to their retreat in the mountains, and warned the Government, which promptly despatched troops. All the mountain passes were guarded and then the hunt began. When Salaveria left Salvador 17 robbers had been captured, and after brief trial, shot.


