PROPERTY AT AUCTION.

A Couple of Flour Mills and the Propeller Ferial 50th.

There was a good attendance in the rooms of the Board of Trade yesterday when Auctioneer Peter Ryan put up for sale two great mills of the name of James Norris of St. Catharines. The capacity of these mills together is 700 barrels per day. The bidding began at \$15,000, which was raised to \$34,000, at which both were knocked down to Mr. John Scully, presumably for the Bank of Commerce.

The Ferial went to Mr. James Carruthers for \$2700, a very low price. She has accommodation for 100 passengers, and can carry about 12,000 bushels of grain through the St. Lawrence Canal.

The New Piano Emporium. The New York & Boston Piano Co., who last Saturday opened their warehouses at 122-124 Yonge-street (near the Erie), have made a new departure in their line of business. Recognizing the general depression of trade and the reduced purchasing power of the public they have set out to sell musical instruments at the lowest possible margin on cost, which they claim to be able to do largely by reducing the heavy expenditures which usually attend the running of the piano business. Their warehouses, whilst bright and convenient are run unexpensively. The staff of high-salaried canvassers has been dispensed with in their case, and from a newspaper point of view the result is that they intend largely curtailing their advertising expenses.


