The increase of women at the entry level of the group is partially attributable to wives of rotational employees entering the Department with the prospect of being assigned overseas with their spouses. Shifts in distribution occurred mainly at the 2, 3 and 4 levels.

Promotions within the group numbered 60, affecting 28 men and 32 women. Nine men and 11 women were promoted to officer groups in the Administrative and Foreign Service Category; five men and six women to the Technical Category. Two women moved out to another Administrative Support Group, while four women entered the group from another Administrative Support Group.

The relocation of a section of Passport Office to Sydney, Nova Scotia, is now projected for 1981.
