The Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Paul Martin, today announced the following appointments in the Canadian diplomatic service:

<u>Mr. Jean-Louis Delisle</u>, who has been Canadian Ambassador to Costa Rica and concurrently accredited to El Salvador, Honduras, Nicaragua and Panama, to be Ambassador to Turkey. Mr. Delisle succeeds Mr. Bruce Williams whose next assignment will be announced in due course.

<u>Mr. J. Blair Seaborn</u> to be Canadian Commissioner to the International Commission for Supervision and Control in Vietnam, succeeding Mr. G. E. Cox, whose tour of duty has been completed. <u>Mr. Norman F. H. Berlis</u> at present Canadian High Commissioner to Tanganyika and Uganda, to be concurrently accredited as High Commissioner to Kenya. Mr. Berlis will continue to reside in Dar-es-Salaam.
