

By Mr. Mercier (St. Henri), for Mr. Pouliot:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, petitions, telegrams, reports and other documents relative to the appointment of the postmaster at St. Arsene, Temiscouata county, since the 2nd of March, 1932.

By Mr. Reid:—Order of the House for a copy of all telegrams, letters, reports and correspondence between the Minister of Public Works or any Officials of his Department, and the District Engineer of the Department of Public Works in the city of New Westminster, or any other person in the province of British Columbia, regarding all matters relating, in any way to the Brunette river.

The House resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Bennett: That it be resolved,—That it is expedient that Parliament do approve of the Trade Agreement entered into at Ottawa the 20th day of August, 1932, between representatives of His Majesty's Government in Canada and of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, and that this House do approve of the same, subject to the legislation required in order to give effect to the fiscal changes consequent thereto.
