

June 18, 1962, by constituencies, as indicated in the return respecting election expenses submitted by the official agent of each candidate, as required under the provisions of section 63 of the Canada Elections Act; and showing also the names of any candidates, by constituencies, on whose behalf election expense returns have not been submitted.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 1*).

On motion of Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Fisher, it was ordered,—That an humble Address be presented to His Excellency praying that he will cause to be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence between the federal government, including any department, branch or directorate thereof, and drug companies, other governments and medical personnel or associations, dated since January 1, 1957, regarding the drug Thalidomide (or Kevadon), and also memoranda or reports concerning the said drug in the possession of the government.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 2*).

On motion of Mr. Fane, seconded by Mr. Fleming (Okanagan-Revelstoke), it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence and documents dealing with the Gold Rush Festival exchanged between the Minister of Northern Affairs and National Resources or officials of his Department and the Chairman of the Gold Rush Festival Committee or the President of the Dawson City Festival Foundation.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 3*).

On motion of Mr. Howard, seconded by Mr. Peters, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of the Report made by W. J. Morris of the University of Manitoba regarding a survey of conditions at the Red Lake Indian Reserve.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 4*).

On motion of Mr. Fisher, seconded by Mr. Peters, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House copies of all correspondence, reports, etc. relating to the provision of airport services for Peterborough, Ontario, that have been exchanged between the government, including DOT and the Prime Minister's office, and any other persons or organizations since January 1, 1962.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 6*).

Notices of Motions for the Production of Papers (Nos. 7, 9, 11, and 13) having been called were allowed to stand at the request of the government.

On motion of Mr. Knowles, seconded by Mr. Peters, it was ordered,—That there be laid before this House a copy of all correspondence, and any records of discussions, exchanged between the government or any Minister thereof and the Civil Service Federation of Canada, the Civil Service Association of Canada and the Professional Institute of the Public Service of Canada, dated since June 18, 1962, regarding (a) pay increases in the public service, and (b) negotiating procedures and ways of resolving differences arising therefrom.—(*Notice of Motion for the Production of Papers No. 10*).
